It gives me great pleasure to introduce the SFD's annual report for the fiscal year 2023, that witnessed the SFD's continues pursuit to fulfill the objectives adopted by the government of the Custodian of the Two Holy Mosques and HRH the Crown Prince, Prime Minister - May Allah protect them - to deepen development cooperation with various countries of the world and back the international efforts aiming at overcoming the challenges confronting brotherly and friendly countries and uplifting their level of comprehensive development.

The year of the report had experienced a growth in SFD's lending operations and an expansion of its development activity to include financing new (9) countries that SFD lends them for the first time, with (13) agreements. During the fiscal year, SFD signed (40) development loan agreements with (29) developing countries, including the new countries, with total obligations of SR 7,661 million. That had raised the number of countries financed by SFD since the inception of its activity and up to the end of the fiscal year 2023 to (93) developing countries around the world. Also, the number of loan agreements signed had reached (779) development financing agreements, that made SFD's total financial obligations reaching to SR 77,856 million. By these development projects that it finances, SFD has contributed to maximizing the development impact and strengthening the infrastructure in various sectors to achieve its development goals. SFD has also contributed to deepening the integration of the Saudi economy into both

the regional and global system by giving the chance to the expertise of the Saudi private sector to participate in the execution of the projects it finances.

Inconclusion, Iemphasize that SFD will continue, God willing, to fulfill its mission entrusted to it as a major supporter in strengthening the Kingdom's role in its development cooperation with the governments and peoples of brotherly and friendly countries in order to accomplish its sustainable development and economic goals.

Overview of the Saudi Fund for Development (SFD)



The Saudi Fund for Development (SFD) was founded by virtue of Royal Decree No. M/48, issued on 14/08/1394 H, corresponding to 01/09/1974. It commenced operations on 18/02/1395 H, corresponding to 01/03/1975.

SFD supports stable economic development by providing financial, technical and human resources leveraging the strengths of the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia to meet the needs of its partners.

Objectives

As defined in its Law, SFD main objective is to contribute to financing development projects in developing countries through granting them the necessary loans and technical aids needed for financing studies and institutional support.



SFD is a general institution and legal entity of an independent financial status. It is managed by the Board of Directors composed of eleven members. SFD CEO assumes the executive authority and is responsible for the implementation of the Board's decisions.



SFD commenced its activity with a capital of ten thousand million saudi riyals provided by the Saudi government. This capital then been increased over three phases to reach thirty-one thousand million riyals.

Scope of Activity

Financing Development Projects

The main activity of SFD is to provide soft loans to the governments of developing countries with unlimited territorial scope. SFD deals directly with the governments of developing countries financing priority development projects, with financing priority to the least developed and low-income countries.

- SFD's Law includes the basic rules for providing development loans.
- Development loans for financing development projects.
- The following conditions have to be met to obtain SFD loans:
 - The project to be financed in the recipient country shall be proved economically or socially feasible.
- The finance of the entire project for which the loan is provided shall be available.
- 3. The loan must be paid and repaid in Saudi riyals.
- The loan amount granted to any project shall not exceed 5% of SFD's capital.
- 5. The total loan amounts granted to any country in one time shall not exceed 10% of SFD capital.

First: Signed Loan Agreements

During the fiscal year 2023, SFD continued its lending activity financing priority economic and social development projects in developing countries and signing 40 loan agreements, including additional loans with 29 developing countries, totaling SR 7,661.26 million. Among these projects were 21 projects in Africa with a total amount of SR 2,943.75 million, 5 projects in Asia and the Pacific with a total amount of SR 1,838.75 million, and 14 projects in the Latin American and Caribbean continent with a total amount of SR 2,878.76 million. It is noteworthy that SFD expanded its lending activity during the fiscal year 2023 to cover 9 new countries (Angola, Antigua and Barbuda, Saint Vincent and Grenadines, Belize, Guyana, the Bahamas, Saint Lucia, Grenada, and Argentina) as shown in the below table:

Second: Sectorial Distribution of Signed Loan Agreements

During 2023, SFD financed a number of development projects in several vital sectors, including the social infrastructure, transportation and communication, energy, agriculture, and other sectors. Among these projects, 27 projects were financed in the social infrastructure sector, representing 64.89% of the total finance, followed by the energy sector, with 5 projects finances representing 22.04%, and 5 projects in the transportation and communications sector representing 10.77%, in addition to financing two projects in other sectors representing 1.47%, and one project in the agricultural sector representing 0.83% of the total finance, as shown in the table below :

This will be achieved by expanding existing water transmission systems, laying new pipelines, and increasing water storage capacity by building new reservoirs in several areas east of the capital Kigali. The project will also expand water distribution networks in some areas and improve existing networks. More than 500,000 people will benefit from the project after its completion.

Uganda

Objectives and Description of Project

The project aims to develop the health sector in the Republic of Uganda, and increase the capacity of cardiovascular medical centers, thus reducing the number of cases receiving treatment abroad. This project will lead to improving healthcare services provided at Uganda Heart Institute, and increasing people's awareness of cardiovascular diseases, increasing the number of skilled and qualified medical personnel in the field of cardiovascular diseases, and training those personnel through specialized courses and workshops.



Objectives and Description of Project

This project aims to secure a sustainable supply of drinking water in the Republic of Mauritius, to satisfy the high demand for water in the southern part of the country. This project will contribute to enhancing economic, social, commercial and agricultural development, and stimulating the tourism sector by providing adequate supplies of drinking water to resorts and hotels to be constructed in the future in the southern region. After completion, the project will harness additional water resources to meet the current and future water demand for various sectors in southern Mauritius and part of the southeast and southwest regions.





This project aims to support the housing sector in the Republic of Seychelles, providing housing units at affordable prices to low-income families. The project will include construction of 3-floor and 4-floor buildings in different locations in the country. Each building will contain 8 apartments with areas ranging from 70 - 85 m2. The project also includes the construction of public service utilities, rainwater drainage and sewage works. This project will improve the quality of life and living conditions of the population, and will enhance equality and cohesion among society members.



Seychelles

Objectives and Description of Project

The project aims to support the education sector in the Republic of Seychelles providing a modern educational environment by reconstructing La Digue School and adding new facilities to it. This includes creating a multi-purpose play court for various sports, a children's playground, an open stadium, and areas for parking bicycles. After its completion, this project will provide a sophisticated educational infrastructure for students on La Digue Island contributing to improving the educational process.

Central Africa

Objectives and Description of Project

This project aims to complete the runway works at the Bangui M'Poko International Airport in the state's capital. The project will contribute to improving navigation, promoting economic and social development, and creating job opportunities in the air transport sector. The project will also include constructing and equipping a hospital with a capacity of 250 beds in the capital to support the health system and improve the quality of healthcare services provided to the population, ensuring good access to such services, in addition to meeting the country's needs for advanced health services for women and children to reduce maternal, infant and newborn mortality.



Burkina Faso

Objectives and Description of Project

The project aims to enhance the quality of healthcare services in the Republic of Burkina Faso by constructing and equipping Manga Regional Hospital and converting the same from a regional hospital (CHR) to a regional university hospital (CHUR). This will be achieved through the construction of 25 facilities on an area of 17,000 sq. m, and the establishment of an auditorium for training that can accommodate up to 200 trainees. This project will contribute to improving the efficiency of university training for future physicians and enhancing and developing the process of scientific research in the field of healthcare services.

Burundi

Objectives and Description of Project

This project aims to improve the quality of healthcare services in Burundi and meet the growing demand for these services. This will be achieved by renovating and expanding the existing three-story hospital building and constructing a new three-story building on an area of approximately 7,000 sq. m. The new building will include outpatient clinics, hospital administration, radiology department, sterilization department, emergency department, pediatrics and maternity clinic, technical department, surgery and hospitalization department. The project will contribute to reducing maternal, infant, and neonatal mortality, lowering the mortality rate from communicable diseases, combating chronic and NCDs, strengthening the health system by improving the quality and accessibility of healthcare for the population, and increasing the capacity for training healthcare professionals.



Objectives and Description of Project

This project aims to increase the percentage of girls enrolled in secondary schools in rural areas of Niger and improve the quality of education and gender equality in access to education. This will be achieved by constructing and equipping boarding secondary schools for girls in several areas. The project includes the construction of buildings for 40 girls' secondary schools located in suitable areas that are centrally located between rural areas and villages to facilitate access to educational facilities. The project works will include the construction of dormitories for students, administrative staff, guards, a kitchen, and a restaurant, and equipping them with furniture and toilets. A fence will also be built around these schools to turn them into girls' boarding schools. All schools will be equipped with solar energy.

Objectives and Description of Project

This project aims to support the Mauritanian government's efforts to expand the higher education capacity by establishing specialized higher education institutes in the fields of administrative and educational sciences. This aims to increase educational opportunities and help graduates to keep pace with the requirements of the labor market and economic development. In addition, the project will contribute to meeting the needs of the service and education sectors by providing qualified personnel with medium and high skills to keep pace with the growing demand for skilled labor in those sectors. It will also promote decentralization in higher education, contribute to reducing the migration of urban and rural residents to the capital, and encourage sustainable development.



Mohmand Dam Hydropower project aims to enhance national energy security and support development in the Islamic Republic of Pakistan, through the construction of this hydropower generation project. Tajikistan

Objectives and Description of Project

This project aims to develop and improve public education in the Republic of Tajikistan, and to cater for the country's needs for educational services to meet the increasing number of students, by constructing, equipping and furnishing a number of schools in different regions of the country. This project comes as part of Phase 5 of the Ministry of Education's program,, which aims to establish, complete and equip a number of schools until 2027.



The projectaims to contribute to enhancing national energy security and supporting development efforts in the Republic of Tajikistan through the establishment of Rogun Hydropower Station Plant with a projected generation capacity of 3,600 megawatts (MW). This project will ensure a steady supply of renewable electricity to meet the growing local demand for electricity and expand its production locally and regionally. The project includes the construction of the main dam with a length of 1.8 km and a height of 335 meters, the construction of four hydraulic tunnels for water diversion and drainage, and the construction of six water channels to provide high water flow to the turbines for power generation.

Saint Vincent and the Grenadines

Objectives and Description of Project

The project aims to develop health services in the Republic of Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, improve the quality of the health system infrastructure and provide modern medical equipment, through the establishment of a primary care facility in South Rivers city with a total estimated area of 460 m2, consisting of three floors with a capacity of up to 10 beds. The facility contains a dental clinic, an HIV follow-up clinic, a non-communicable diseases clinic, a family planning clinic, physical therapy and psychological care. The project includes supply of electrical and mechanical systems, equipment and medical devices, in addition to office furniture.



The project aims to develop health services in the Republic of Belize, by strengthening the health infrastructure in the city of Belmopan, providing cutting-edge medical equipment, and training health personnel and students at the University of Belize to provide integrated health services to citizens. The project will contribute to easing the burden on Karl Heusner Hospital by establishing a Tertiary hospital, with a capacity ranging between 150-200 beds. Belize

Objectives and Description of Project

This project aims to support and promote green energy in the Republic of Belize, through the establishment of solar energy plants with a total capacity of no less than 60 megawatts, and the supply and installation of solar panels. Through the improvement of production and consumption efficiency to reach at least 100 Gwh/year, this project will contribute to reducing CO2 emissions by 60 thousand tons of co2 equivalent per year. The project will also add at least 60 megawatts of green energy to the national electricity grid, which would result in improved reliability of electricity grid and reduced cost of electricity, as well as promoting the energy sector in a way that contributes to economic development, enabling economic diversification, enhancing the country's competitiveness, and reducing reliance on importing energy from neighboring countries. The project will also limit the outflow of foreign exchange by paying for energy in Belize dollar.



Cooperative Guyana

Objectives and Description of Project

This project aims to develop the housing sector in the Cooperative Republic of Guyana, to meet the growing demand for housing units. The project includes development of infrastructure to provide 2,500 housing units in three separate administrative regions of the country. This project will contribute to the development and growth of the private sector in the construction, and housing sectors, and providing affordable housing unit, especially for those with low and middle income, with a view to maintaining the social and economic well-being of citizens, increasing housing occupancy rates, and facilitating the construction of public social facilities such as schools and health centers. The infrastructure work of the project includes leveling the project land, pave and asphalt the main and secondary roads, and extend sewage lines, drinking water and electricity transmission and distribution lines, construction of social facilities such as gardens and green spaces, installation of road lighting, and drilling wells at all areas of the project, in addition to building a health center, police station, and fire station.





The project aims to support the transportation sector in the Cooperative Republic of Guyana, through the construction of a new four-lane bridge parallel to the existing bridge (Mackenzie-Wismar), with a length of 220 meters and a height of 5.11 meters. The new bridge will facilitate traffic and reduce traffic congestion at peak times. It will be linked to the existing road network on both sides of the Demerara River. The construction of the bridge will also ensure easier access to nearby public facilities such as Mackenzie Hospital and other government facilities.



The project aims to revive and promote tourism and investment and accelerate economic growth in the Commonwealth of The Bahamas, as well as to increase entrepreneurs and create jobs opportunities to enhance the visitor experience in general. The project includes construction of several two-floor facilities on three islands to accommodate small business, including 50 projects on Nassau Island, 25 projects on Exuma Island and 25 projects on Grand Bahama Island. Bahamas

Objectives and Description of Project

The Family Islands Airports Renaissance Project aims to increase the operational capacity of Bahamas airports, increase the number of passengers, and hence the state revenues making Exuma area the second tourist destination in the country after the capital, Nassau. The project will contribute to developing and upgrading the capabilities of airports in Exuma Islands, to encourage more visitors to the islands. The airport's capacity is expected to increase after its completion from 237,000 to 285,000 visitors annually. It is also expected that the total number of passengers through these airports will reach 2 million passengers per year by 2033, with a total number of flights reaching 11,400 flights. After completion, the project will create 110 direct job opportunities during the operation process.



SFD's Cumulative Contributions

Since the beginning of its lending activity back in (1975) until the end of the fiscal year (2023), SFD financed a total of 779 development loans to finance 739 development projects and programs with a total of SR 76,951.31 million in 93 developing countries in various regions of the world. In addition to signing 2 financing agreements with the International Development Association (IDA) for a total of SR 904.94 million, thus, the total provided by SFD reach SR 77,856.25 million, as shown in the following figures:

Geographical Distribution of the Total Number and Amount of SFD's Projects and Programs

In the geographical distribution of its assistance, SFD focuses on financing development projects in developing countries around the world without exception. It focuses on the least developed and the poorest countries. In this context, SFD has directed most of its assistance towards Africa and Asia and the Pacific due to their low level of economic and social development, and their urgent need to develop the basic infrastructure necessary to provide services and develop human capacities; thus, contributing to achieving sustainable development. As such, SFD has financed 433 development projects and programs in 47 African countries with a total of SR 43,057.56 million and contributed to the financing of 271 development projects and programs in 31 Asia and the Pacific countries with a total of SR 29,192.86 million. It also financed 14 development projects and programs in 4 European countries with a total of SR 29,192.86 million. It also financed 14 development projects and programs in 4 European countries with a total of SR 3,564.72 million, benefiting 11 countries. It should be noted that SFD signed 2 financing agreements with the International Development Association (IDA) for a total of SR 904.94 million.

SFD contributed to supporting development projects in various infrastructure sectors identified within the framework of its development activity, including the infrastructure and production sectors, such as transportation and communications, social infrastructure, agriculture, energy, and industry and mining. The social infrastructure sector ranked first among the sectors financed by SFD, with 254 development projects and programs. Ranking second is the transportation and communications sector with 234 development projects and programs. Furthermore, the agriculture sector ranked third with 98 funded development projects and programs. Also, the energy sector ranked fourth with a total of 82 SFD-funded development projects and programs. In other sectors, SFD funded 55 development projects and programs. As for the industry and mining sector, SFD funded 16 development projects and programs. Lastly, SFD also signed 2 financing agreements with international organizations.

Sectorial and Geographical Distribution of the Total Number and Amount of SFD Projects and Programs

Since the start of its development activity until the end of 2023, SFD has contributed to the financing of 739 development projects and programs. The finance included social infrastructure, transportation and communications, agriculture, energy, industry, mining and other sectors. Many countries in Africa, Asia and the Pacific, Europe and Latin America and the Caribbean benefited from this finance. It included 433 development projects and programs in Africa with a total of SR 43,057.56 million; 271 development projects and programs in Asia and the Pacific with a total of SR 29,192.86 million; 14 development projects and programs in Europe with a total of SR 1,136.17 million, and 21 development projects and programs in Latin America and the Caribbean with a total of SR 3,564.72 million. SFD also signed two loan agreements with international organizations for a total of SR 904.94 million.

Project in the Spotlight

- SFD's Efforts to Enhance Water Security in Developing Countries
- The Contribution of the Private Sector in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia to the Implementation of Projects Financed by SFD

Water is the source of life on planet earth. It is the key driver of all economic and social activities of mankind to manage their daily affairs and provide a decent living. The issue of water security and access to clean and safe water is of particular importance in international development. It is closely linked to public health, food and energy provision, livelihood promotion, environmental protection, and the eradication of hunger and poverty. Ensuring water security leads to the protection of fragile water systems in developing countries, mitigating the effects of water-related hazards such as floods and droughts, empowering everyone to benefit from water and related services, and managing water resources in an integrated, fair, and sustainable manner.

Ensuring access to safe and sustainable water sources is a major challenge for developing countries. Limited and scarce water resources due to depletion, drought, and pollution exacerbate this issue. Concerted and intensified international efforts are needed to provide water and facilitate access to it for all uses. Raising awareness of water security's importance in the international development agenda is crucial for achieving sustainable development. The United Nations' adoption of Goal 6 of the Sustainable Development Goals reflects this. This goal stipulates "Ensure availability and sustainable management of water and sanitation for all" and managing them sustainably for human health, the environment, and water resource sustainability. Achieving water security, as embodied in Goal 6, contributes to achieving other water-related international development goals such as food security, energy security, and promoting public health for all. In this aspect, the world celebrates two international events related to water and sanitation every year. These are: World Water Day on March 22, and World Toilet Day on November 19. These two events aim to raise global awareness of water-related issues. They also draw people's attention to the slogan of the event to inspire development action globally.



The events further stimulate international efforts related to enhancing water security. In this context, the International Decade for Action on «Water for Sustainable Development», began on World Water Day, 22 March 2018. It will end on World Water Day, 22 March 2028. The decade's aim is to accelerate international efforts towards addressing water-related challenges. These challenges include limited access to safe water and sanitation facilities. They also include increasing pressure on water resources and water systems. Reducing the risk of drought and climate change is another important goal.


Sustainable development projects for water, both surface and groundwater, are essential for achieving water security. These projects meet development needs for water use in various sectors: agriculture, industry, energy, homes, buildings, hospitals, schools, and more. The need for water projects in developing countries is growing due to increasing scarcity of surface and groundwater. This scarcity is caused by several factors: pollution, rising collection costs due to climate change, and increased demand from a growing population. This pressure on water resources leads to depletion. SFD recognizes the importance of financing water security projects in developing countries. These projects ensure sufficient water supplies for drinking, irrigation, clean energy generation, food production, and public health, promoting sustainable development in its entirety. This section highlights the Fund's efforts in supporting water, sanitation, and related development projects. These efforts aim to support and enhance water security in developing countries.

SFD's activity in financing projects in the water, sanitation and water-related sectors:

Since its inception, SFD has played a prominent role in supporting water and sanitation projects, as well as water-related sub-development projects. This commitment continues today. SFD prioritizes these projects because they are crucial for advancing economic and social development, especially in developing countries facing water scarcity and environmental challenges. Water resources, in all their forms and uses, are essential in this context. SFD dedicates a significant portion of its contributions to the social infrastructure sector. Here, it prioritizes projects that provide safe drinking water and improve sanitation systems. These projects play a vital role in improving public health in developing countries by eliminating water-borne diseases that endanger millions of lives. Recognizing water's importance for sectors like agriculture and energy, SFD has also financed irrigation and wastewater projects. Additionally, it has supported agricultural projects involving dams, irrigation canals, and hydroelectric dams. These projects contribute to developing countries' efforts in achieving food security and clean energy security. In total, SFD has financed 129 development projects in the water, sanitation, and water-related sectors. These projects represent a cumulative investment of SR 14,895.65 million.

First: Projects of Potable Water and Sanitation

As part of its efforts to enhance water security in developing countries, finding sustainable sources of clean drinking water, building wastewater networks to reduce water pollution and fight the spread of water-borne diseases to ultimately improves public health and fosters the development of healthy and safe communities and to contribute to economic and social development, SFD has funded 60 projects in this field with a total value exceeding 6,624.09 SR million. The breakdown of these projects is as follows: 40 projects focus on providing drinking water. 5 projects concentrate on building wastewater networks. The remaining 15 projects address other water and sanitation-related needs. A diagram further illustrates this project breakdown (as shown below).



Second: Water Projects for Agricultural Purposes

SFD is dedicated to support water projects aimed at providing water for agricultural purposes in developing countries throughout its great developmental journey. This comes in recognition of the importance of water in enhancing agriculture, increasing agricultural production, and achieving food security in light of the severe shortage faced by the developing countries in this field. In this regard, SFD has also funded 55 development projects in order to provide water for agriculture, with a total value of SR 5,520.51. SFD's projects have diversified among construction of agricultural dams, which reached (31 projects), irrigation channels (17 projects), and irrigation and drainage (7 projects), as shown in the following diagram.



Fifth: Saudi Program for Digging Wells and Rural Development in Africa

The Kingdom has launched this Program in 1981 in response to the needs of African countries. The first phase of implementation began in 1982 with the aim of digging and preparing drinking-water wells for rural populations. This is for direct contribution in order to mitigate the impact of drought on African countries in various rural areas. The implementation of this Program continued in five phases, with a total allocation of SR1,237.50, to drill and prepare 8,800 wells that will benefit over 4.5 million people across the African continent.

In the fiscal year 2023, the Saudi Private Sector participated in implementing some of the projects that SFD contributed to funding them, as the number of Saudi contracts reached 9 contracts, representing 26% of the total contracts, with an amount exceeding SR198.52 million, representing 36% of the total contract amounts. 


