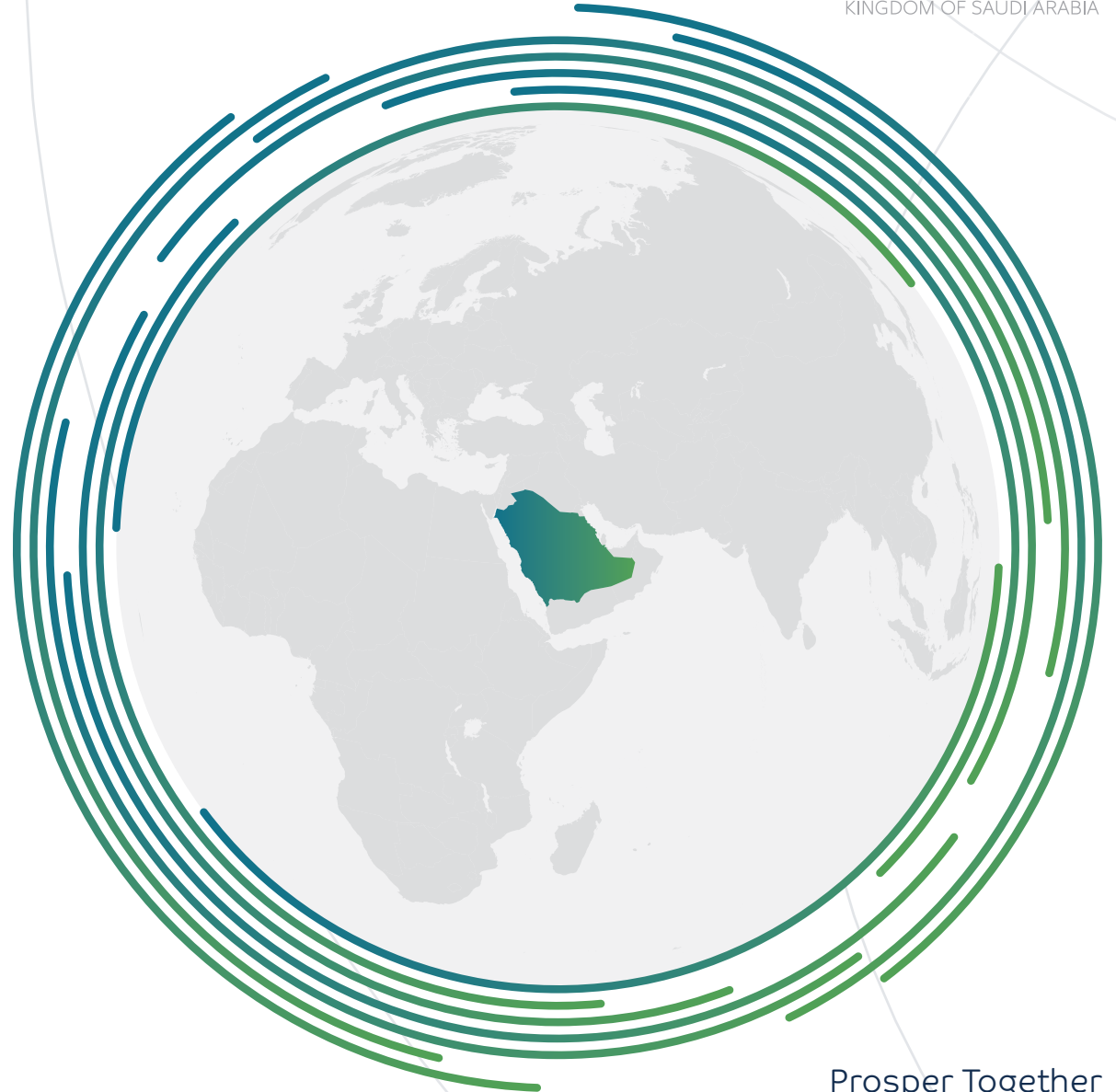

On behalf of the Saudi Fund for Development's (SFD) Board of Directors, it gives me great pleasure to introduce SFD's annual report for the fiscal year 2021. The report reviews SFD's activities and documents SFD's efforts to fulfill its mission and to support the Kingdom's development efforts in the beneficiary countries. As a result of Coronavirus (Covid-19) pandemic, many of SFD's development projects were disrupted and goods and services provided to those projects were suspended. Accordingly, progress of many projects, whether those that were directly financed or co-financed by SFD, witnessed a slowdown. In addition, given the circumstances, financing new development was a challenge.

Given the primary role as a main channel for official development assistance provided by the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, until 2021, SFD provided assistance amounted to SR. 69328 million to finance 695 development projects and programs, including 408 in Africa, 265 in Asia and 22 in other regions.

I am confident that SFD will continue its efforts to achieve objectives adopted by the government of the Custodian of the Two Holy Mosques and HRH the Crown Prince - May Allah protect them - to support international development and strengthen the Kingdom's role as an active member of the international community. The Kingdom seeks to help all, regardless of religious identity or geographical location, enabling brotherly and friendly countries to achieve their development goals and improve quality of life for their people.

Saudi Fund for Development (SFD) in Brief



Foundation:

The Saudi Fund for Development (SFD) was founded by virtue of Royal Decree No. M/48, issued on 14/08/1394 corresponding 01/09/1974. It commenced operations on 18/02/1395 corresponding to 01/03/1975.



Management and Organization:

SFD is a general institution and legal entity of an independent financial status. It is managed by Board of Directors composed of ten members. SFD's CEO assumes the executive authority and he is responsible for the implementation of the Board's decisions.



Objectives:

As defined in its Law, SFD's main objective is to contribute to financing development projects in the developing countries by granting them the necessary loans, the technical aids necessary for financing studies and institutional support.



Capital:

SFD has commenced its activity with a capital of SR. 10 billion provided by the Saudi government. This capital had then been increased in three phases to reach SR. 31 billion.



Scope of Activity

Financing of Development Projects

SFD contributes to these projects by providing soft loans. Its activity is not geographically restricted, and it also deals directly with the governments of the developing countries in order to contribute to financing the priority development projects. SFD prioritizes the financing of the least developed and low-income countries.

- SFD's charter includes the basic regulations for providing development loans.
- Development Loans for Financing Development projects.
- The following conditions have to be met to obtain the SFD's loan:
 - A. The project to be financed in the recipient country shall be proved economically or socially feasible.
 - B. The finance of the entire project for which the loan is provided shall be available.
 - C. The loan shall be disbursed and repaid in Saudi Riyal.
 - D. The loan amount granted to any project shall not exceed 5% of the Fund's capital.
 - E. The total loan amounts granted to any country in one time shall not exceed 10% of the Fund's capital.



Financing Development Projects in Energy, Infrastructure, Transport, Water, and Communication Sectors in Pakistan

Under the patronage of His Royal Highness Prince Mohammed bin Salman bin Abdulaziz, the Saudi Crown Prince, Deputy Prime Minister, and Minister of Defense, and the Prime Minister of Pakistan, Mr. Ahmed Aqeel Al-Khateeb, Chairman of the Saudi Fund for Development (SFD), signed a framework memorandum of understanding with Mr. Makhdoom Shah Mahmood Qureshi, the Pakistani Minister of Foreign Affairs. The agreement addresses Saudi Arabia's contribution – via SFD – in financing development projects in the energy, infrastructure, transport, water, and communication sectors in Pakistan.

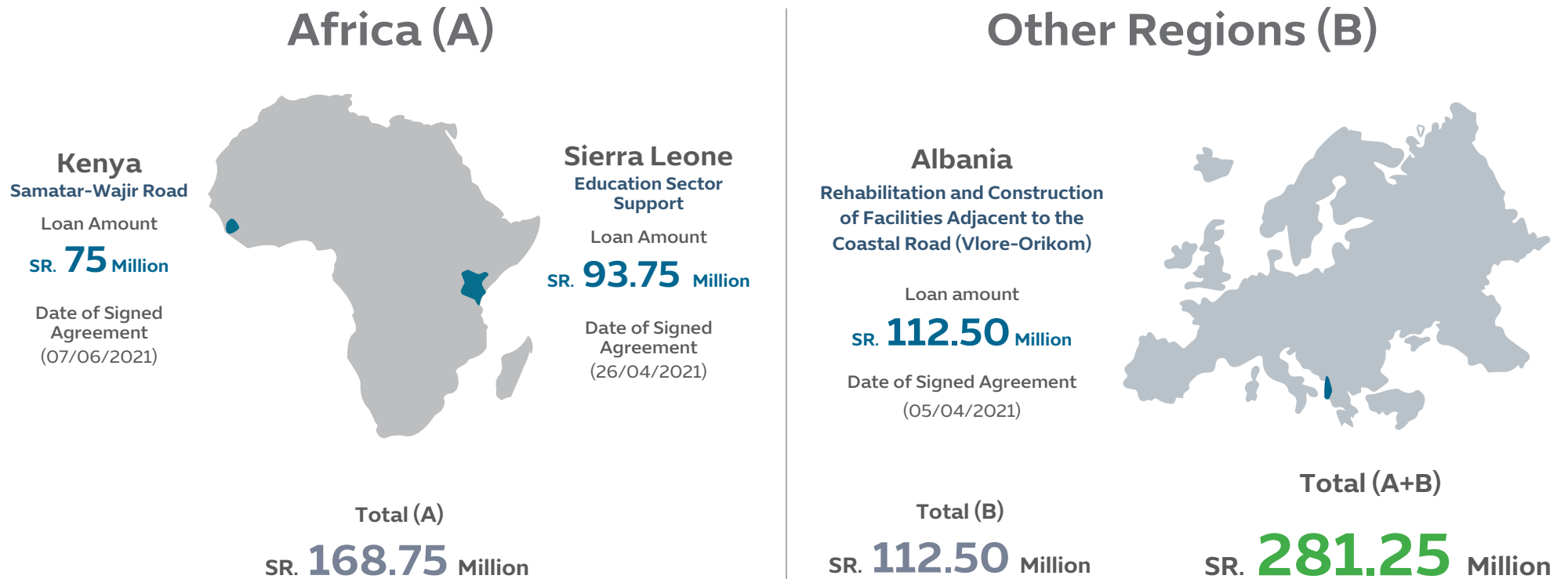

Development Activity during the Fiscal Year (2021)

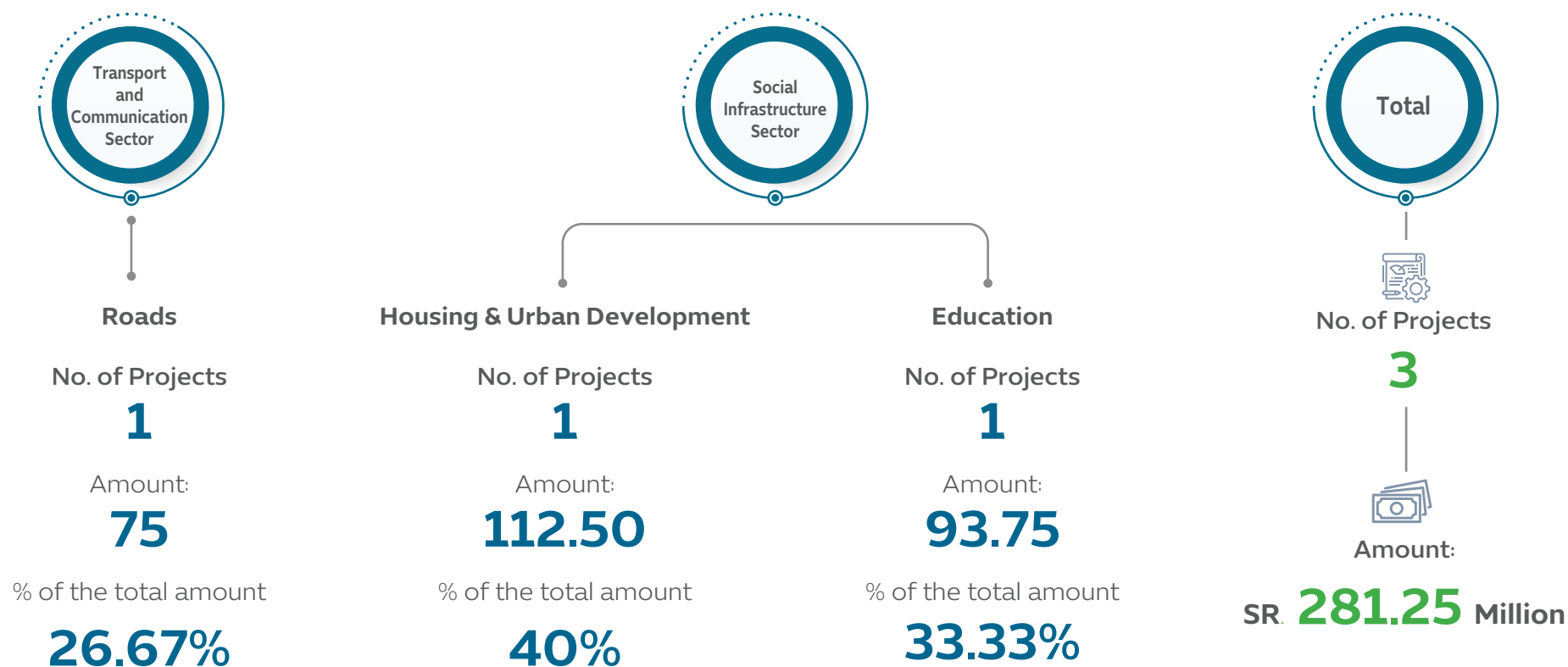
1. Signed Loans Agreements

In continuation of SFD's efforts to finance the development projects in developing countries and enhance the international development process, SFD has signed three loan agreements in the fiscal year 2021 with 3 developing countries at a total value of SR. 281.25 million to contribute to the financing of three development projects and programs. These included two development projects and programs in Africa at a total value of SR. 168.75 million, and one development project in other regions at a total value of SR. 112.50 million. These projects are illustrated in the following drawing:



2. Sectorial Distribution of Signed Loans Agreements

During 2021, SFD continued its activity to support development projects and programs in a number of developing countries. That included the financing of transport and communication sector and social infrastructure sector, including sectors of road, education, housing and urban development, which are given high priority in development plans and programs in some developing countries in Africa and Other Regions. SFD financed two development projects in Africa in the road and education sectors with a total value of SR. 168.75 million. SFD also financed one development project in the housing and urban development sector in Other Regions with a total value of SR. 112.50 million.





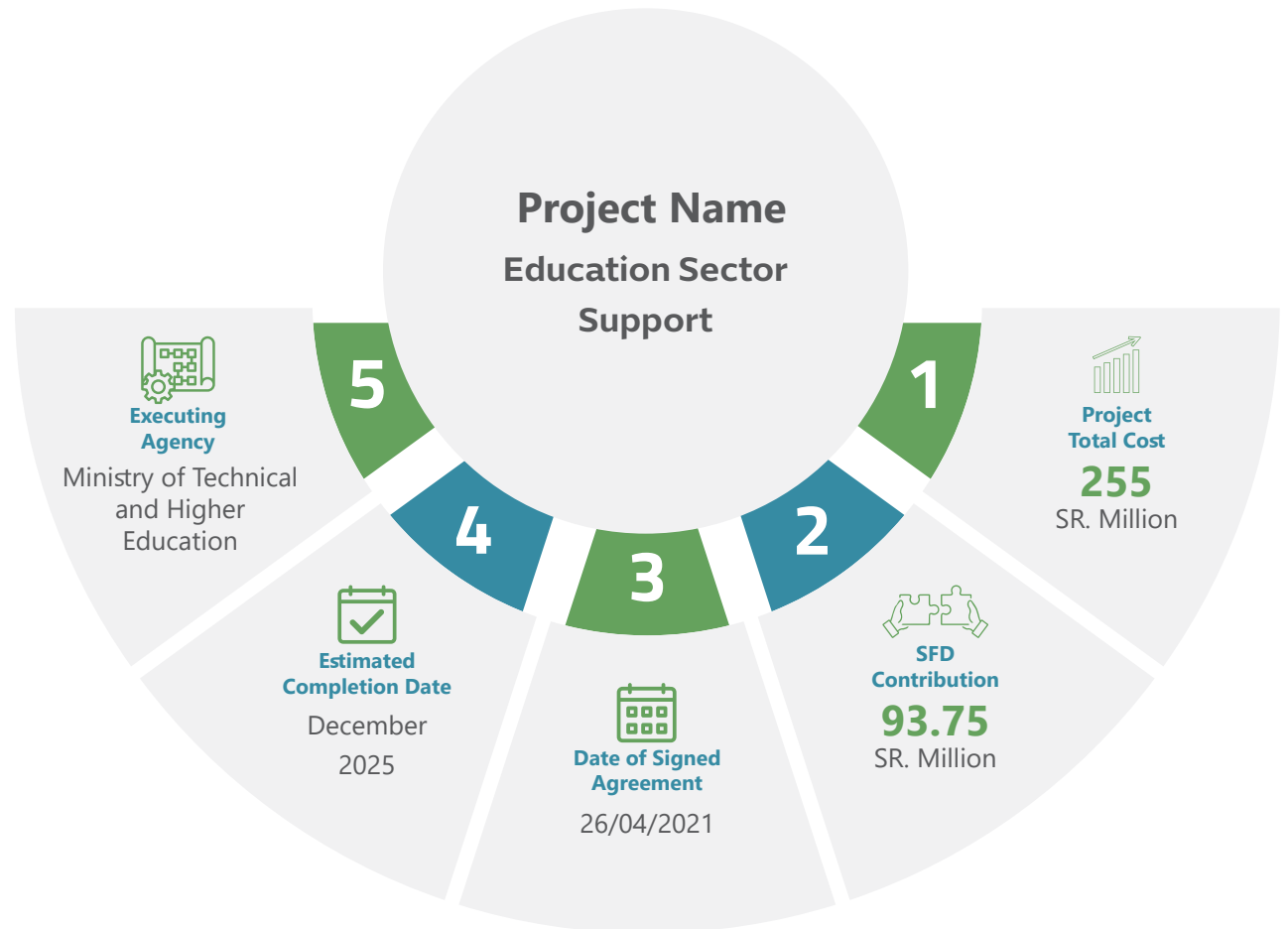


3. The Signed Projects

Sierra Leone

Project Description and Objectives

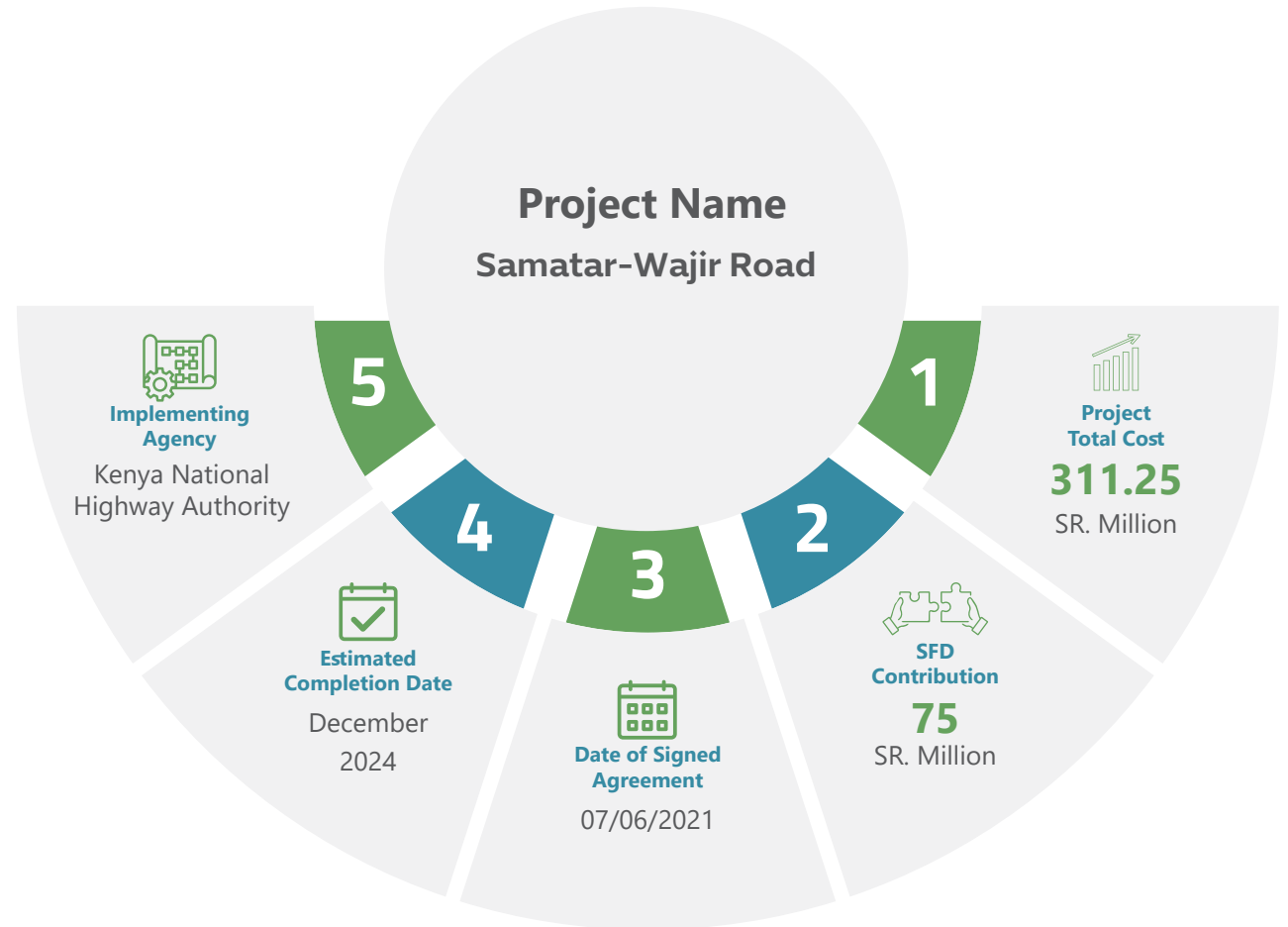
The project aims to develop human resources and raise quality and efficiency of education in order to bridge the educational and knowledge gap between Sierra Leone and the world. This project is a priority for the Government of Sierra Leone. It is a part of the country's human development and education promotion strategy. This strategy is in line with phase II of the poverty reduction strategy and the country's education strategy.



Kenya

Project Description and Objectives

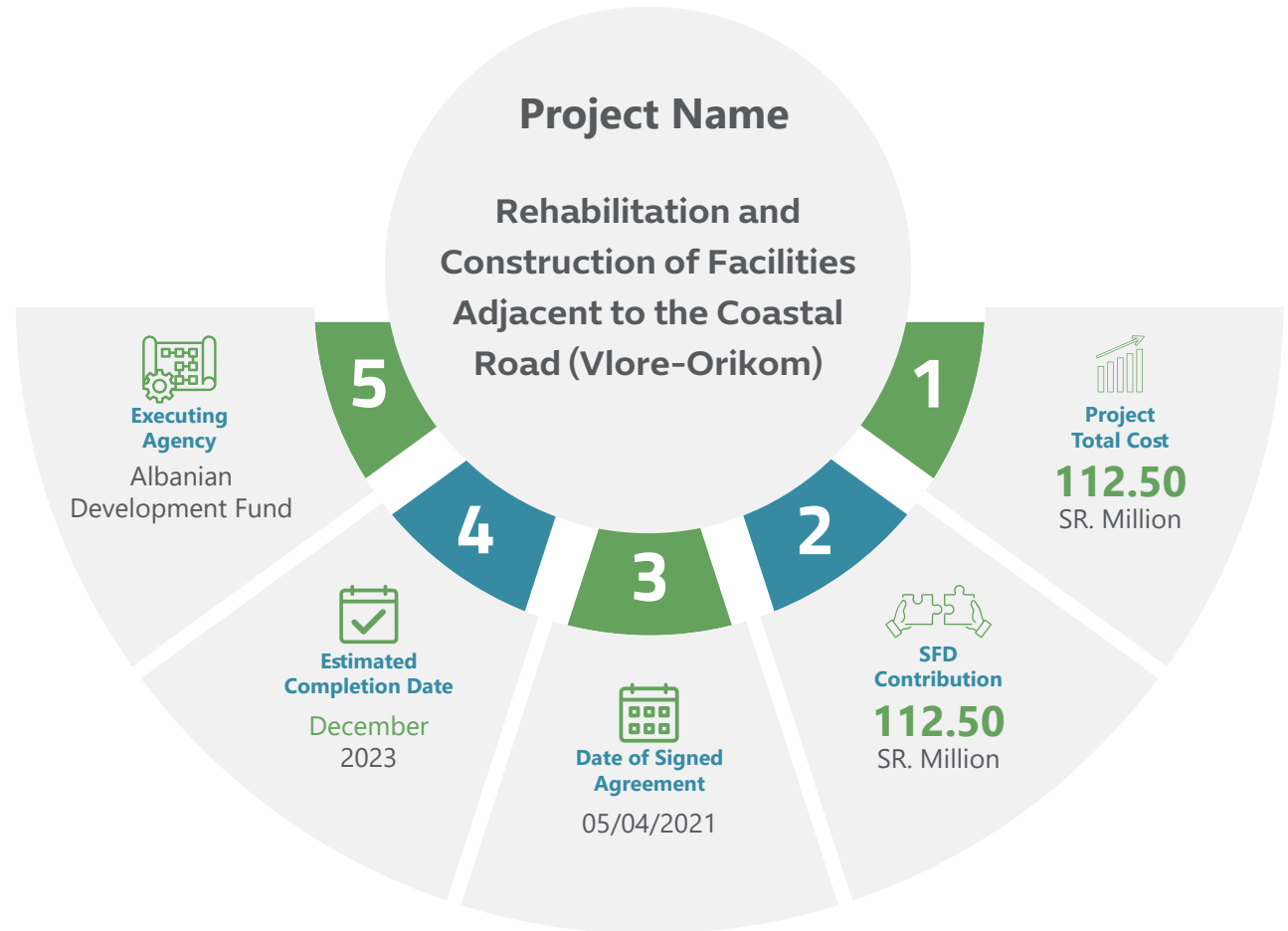
The project aims to support the transport and communications sector in the Republic of Kenya through the construction of 90 km Samatar - Wajir Road. This project is a part of the Kenya's government program to construct road between Isiolo and Mandera. This road will enhance the movement of people and goods between the provinces of Isiolo, Wajir, Garissa and Mandera.



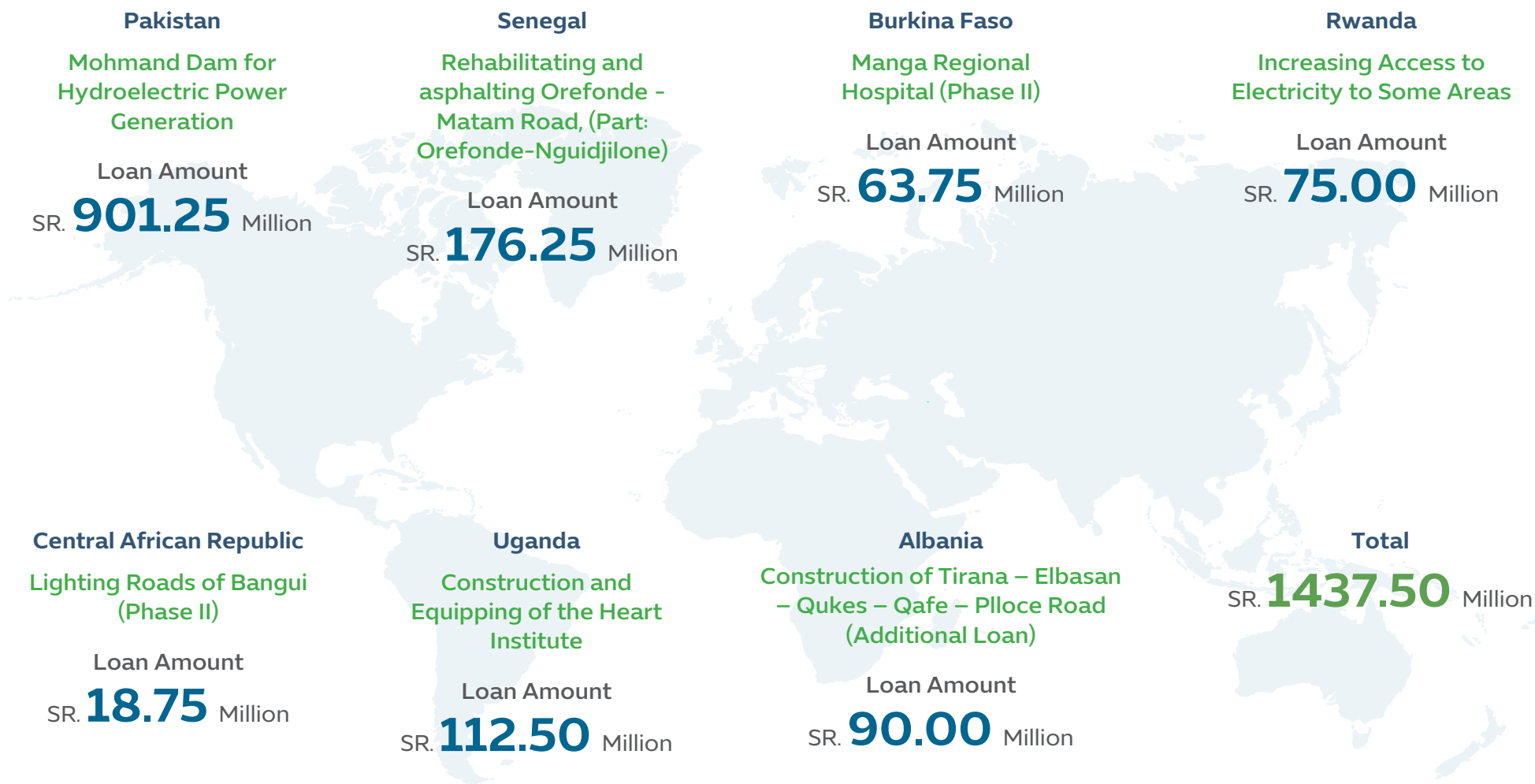
Albania

Project Description and Objectives

The project aims to raise service standards provided to the coastal area adjacent to the coastal road (Vlore-Orikom), which is 10 km long. The project includes the construction of a bicycle path, a sidewalk and parking lots, as well as construction of a number of parks and public facilities.



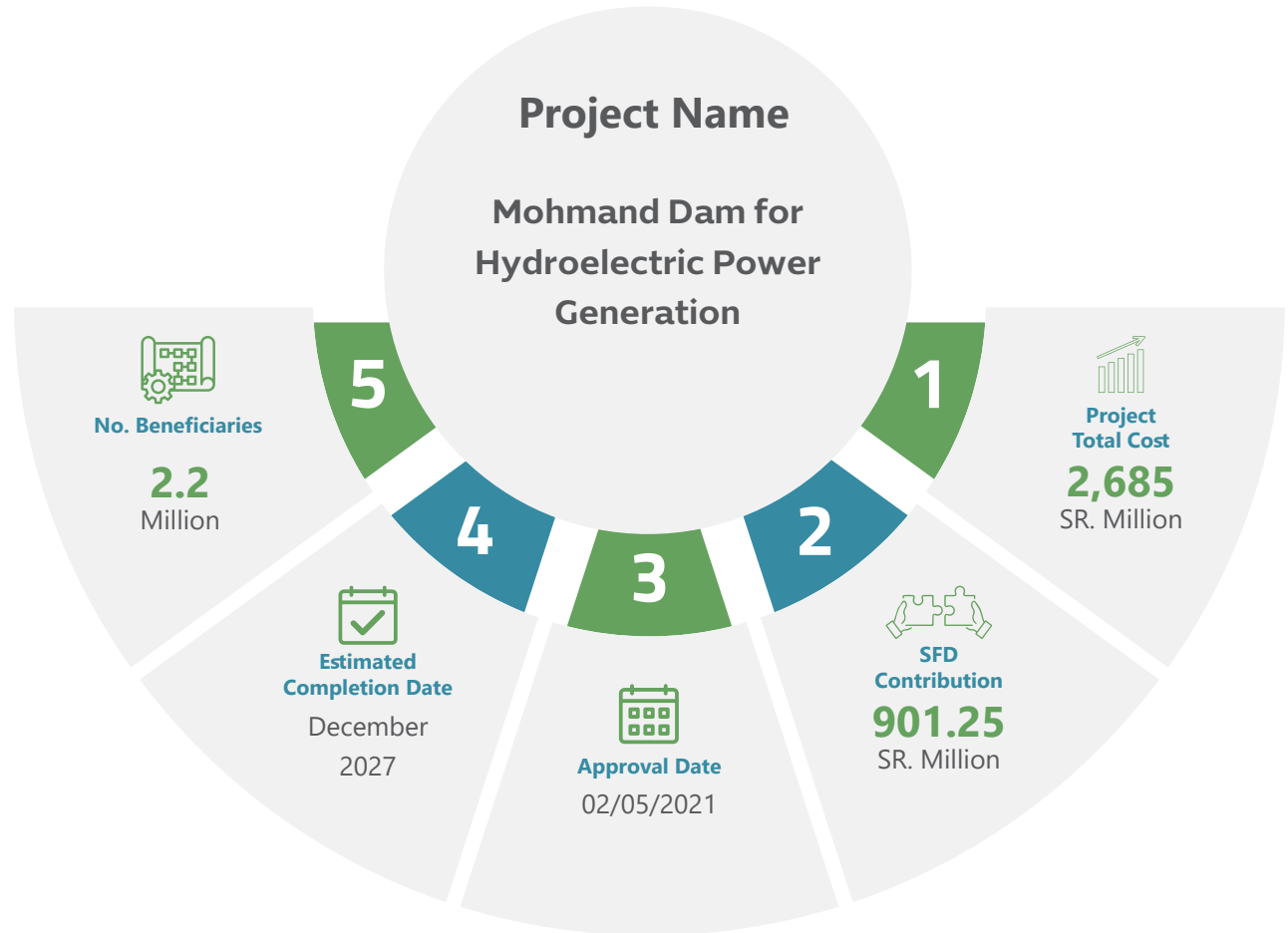
4. Loans Approved by the Board of Directors



Pakistan

Project Description and Objectives

This project aims to generate hydroelectric power with a capacity of 800 mw, as well as alleviate and control floods in the region. It also aims to provide irrigation water for 6773 hectares of new agricultural areas, and supply Peshawar with 13.30 million cubic meters/year of drinking water. The project raises service standards provided to the beach area adjacent to the coastal road (Vlore-Orikom), which is 10 km long. The project includes the construction of a bicycle path, a sidewalk and parking, as well as rehabilitation of parks and public facilities. The dam is rocky and covered with concrete. It is 213m feet long. Its total storage volume is 1.594 million cubic meters. Its live storage volume is 834 million cubic meters, with an installed capacity of 2,862 gw/h. The total length of the reservoir is 56 km in the rocky strait of the Swat River.

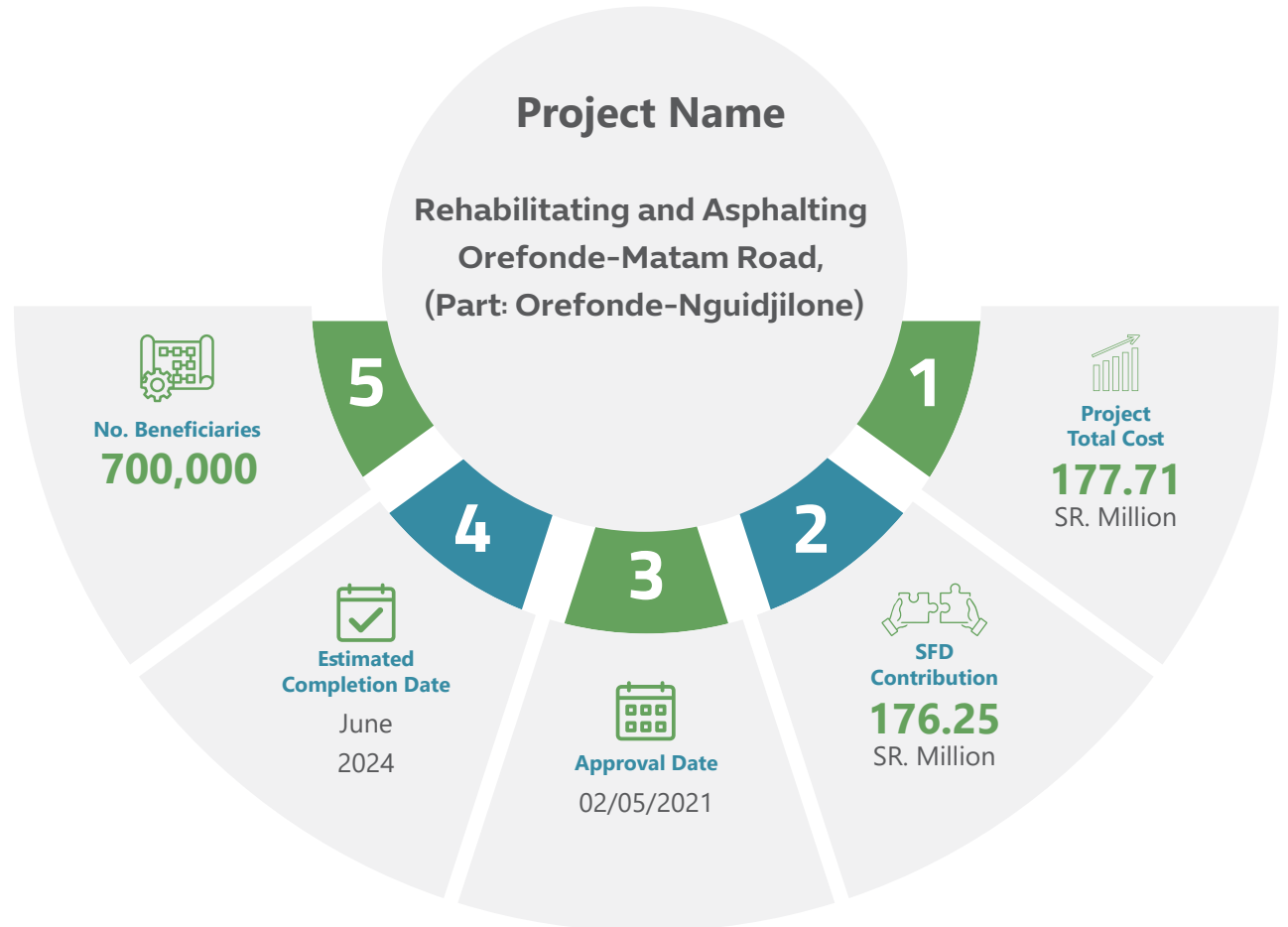


Senegal

Project Description and Objectives

The project aims to prepare and asphalt 62 km Orefonde - Nguidjilone Road, with construction of dirt tracks, fences for schools adjacent to the road, water wells, and emergency units along the road to implement the safety policy on the road and treat the injured in case of accidents on the road before they are transferred to major medical centers.

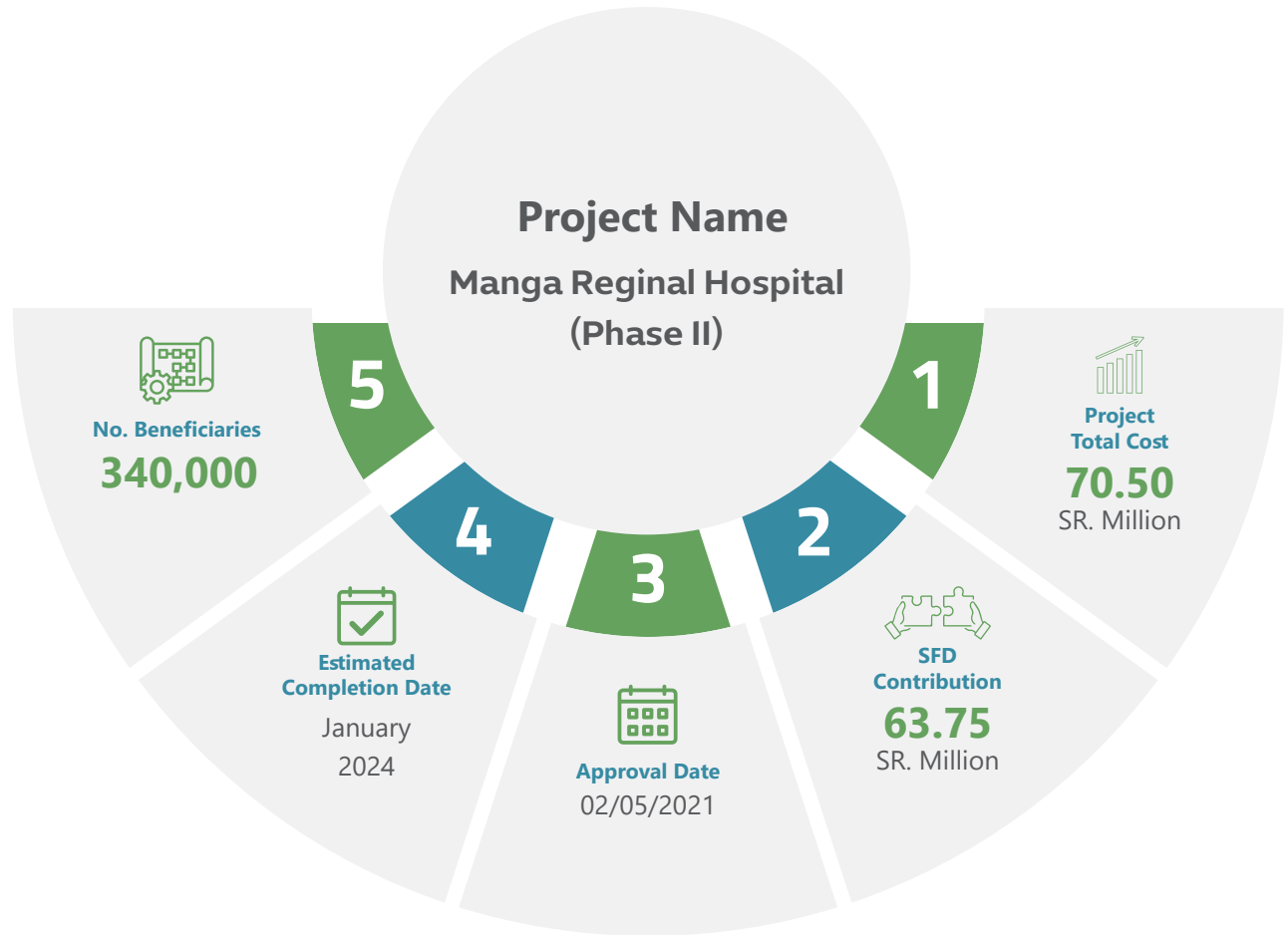
Digging wells would provide drinking water for travelers and residents along the way. The overall objective of the project is to contribute to combating poverty and increasing trade exchanges between regions by improving mobility in the project area. The project has specific goals, namely: Improve the level of services on the road, reduce travel time and vehicle operating cost, improve the living conditions of the residents of the project area by exploiting the agricultural and pastoral potentials in the area, and strengthen trade exchanges with neighboring countries such as Mali and Mauritania. It aims to market agricultural products and facilitate the transport of mining products.



Burkina Faso

Project Description and Objectives

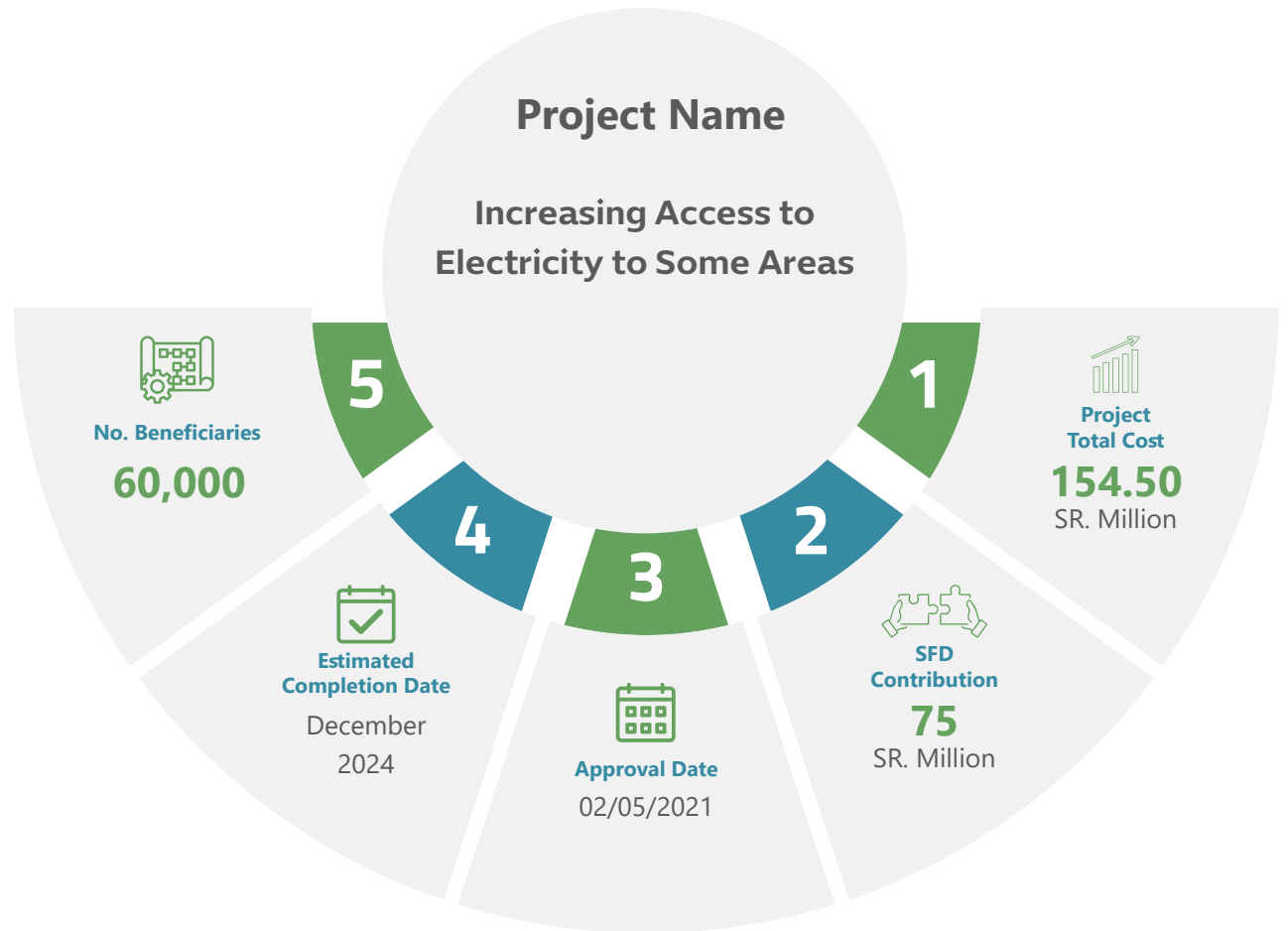
In phase II, the project aims to improve the health status of the population in the project area by enhancing the specific objectives of phase I, which are as follows: enhance the provision of high-quality health services in the project area, strengthen the infrastructure and equipment of Manga Reginal Hospital for emergency response, strengthen the technical platform of the hospital with the aim of converting the Regional Hospital Center (CHR) into a Regional University Hospital Center (CHUR), and strengthen hospital infrastructure and equipment in order to improve security standards.



Rwanda

Project Description and Objectives

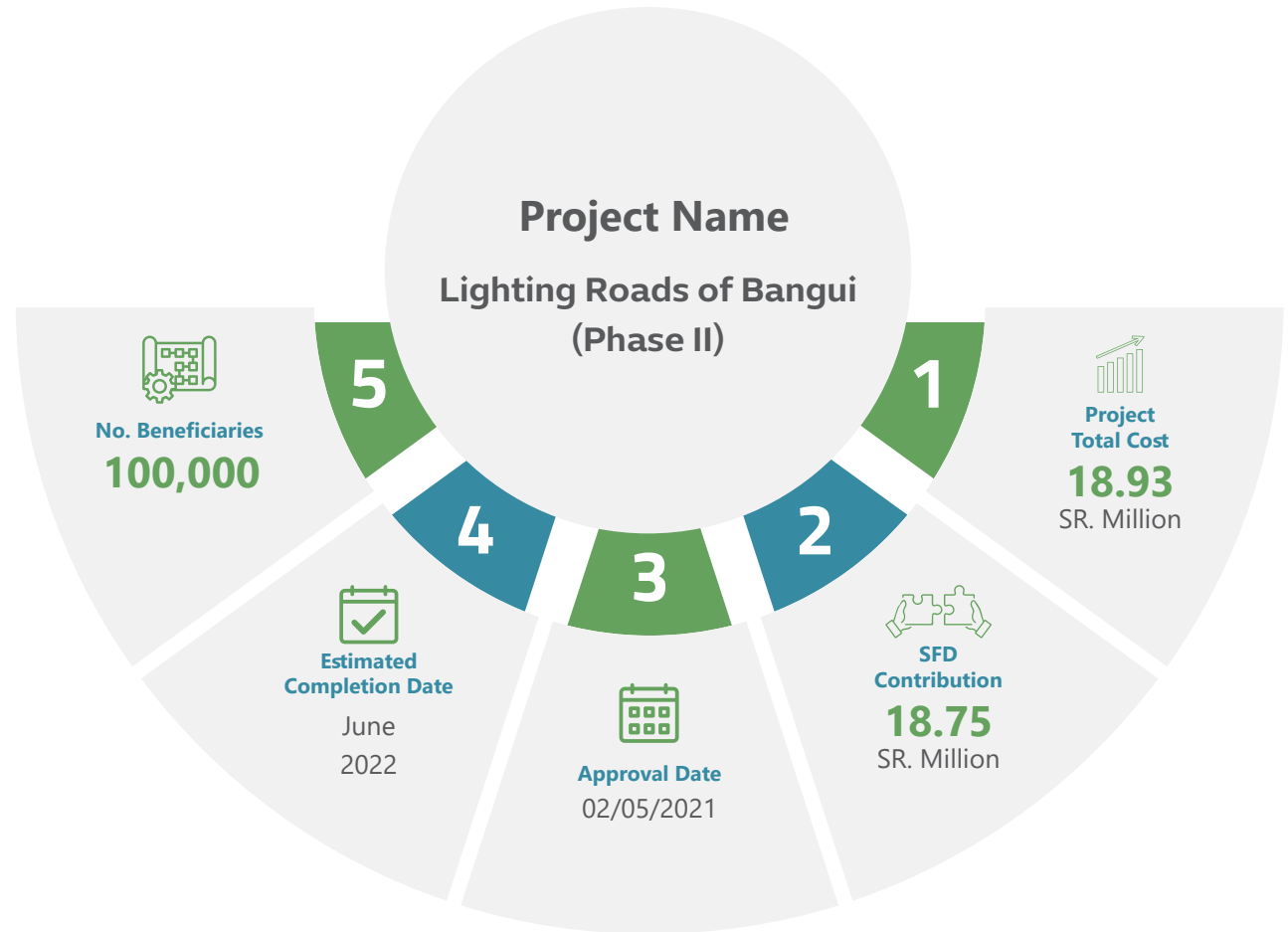
The project aims to increase the economic and social development in Rwanda within the framework of the economic development and poverty reduction, by delivering electricity to the beneficiaries in the three different regions. The project serves 60,000 beneficiaries through the supply, installation and construction of medium and low pressure lines and distribution transformers and delivering them to homes, social and government services, in a low-cost and high-reliability way. The project will enhance economic, agricultural and industrial activities, leading to an increase in employment and thus an increase in income.



Central African

Project Description and Objectives

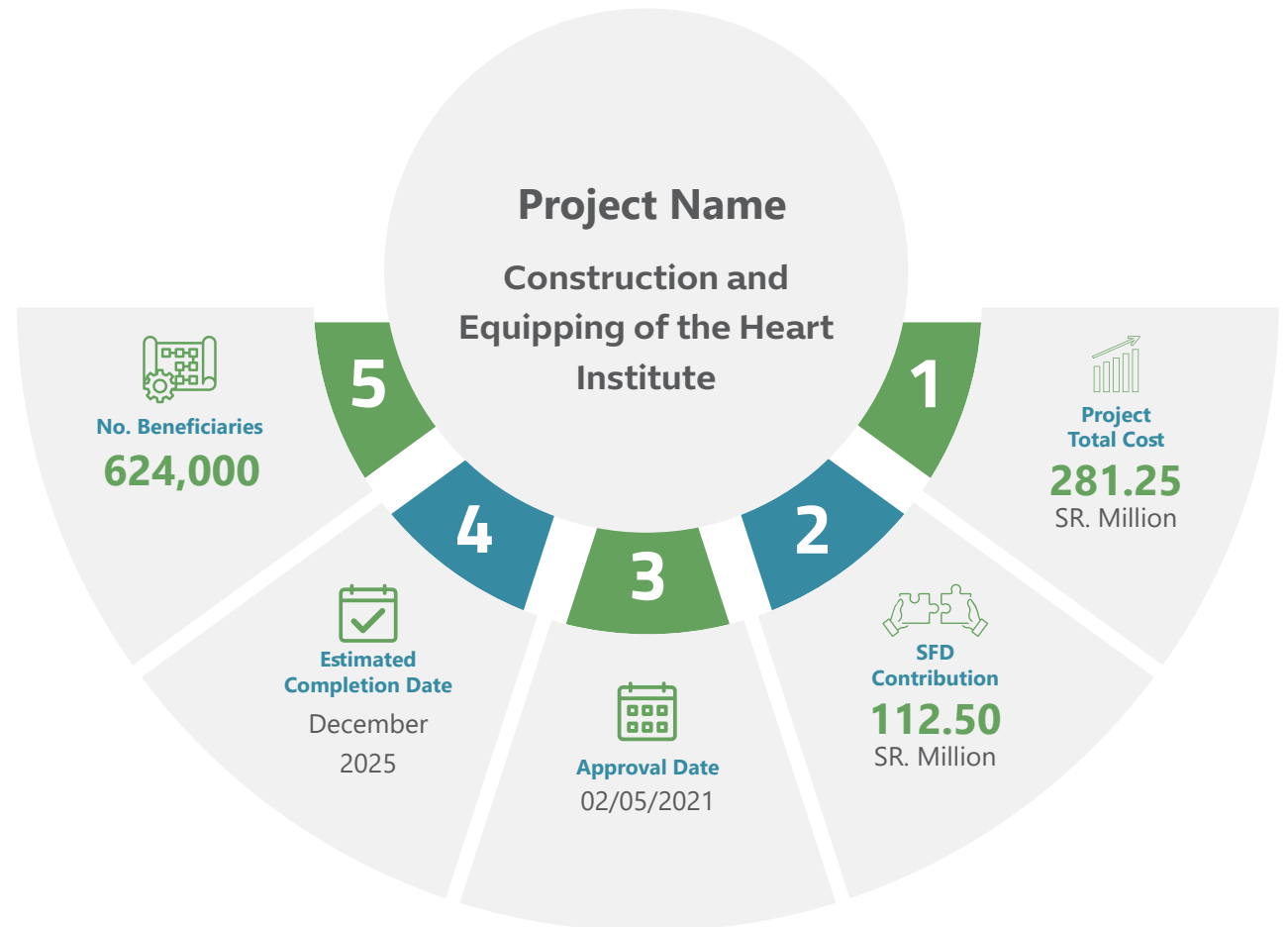
The project aims to increase the provision of energy supply by completing the lighting of several roads in length of 70 km in Bangui with solar energy. The project will also help in combating poverty by stimulating social and economic activities in the targeted roads and streets. The project is a part of the government's strategy to combat poverty and facilitate access of segments of society to energy. This helps serve the community, contribute to the resumption of commercial activities by young craftsmen, provide necessary lighting for students, so that they can study, and enable affected and displaced people to return to their homes.



Uganda

Project Description and Objectives

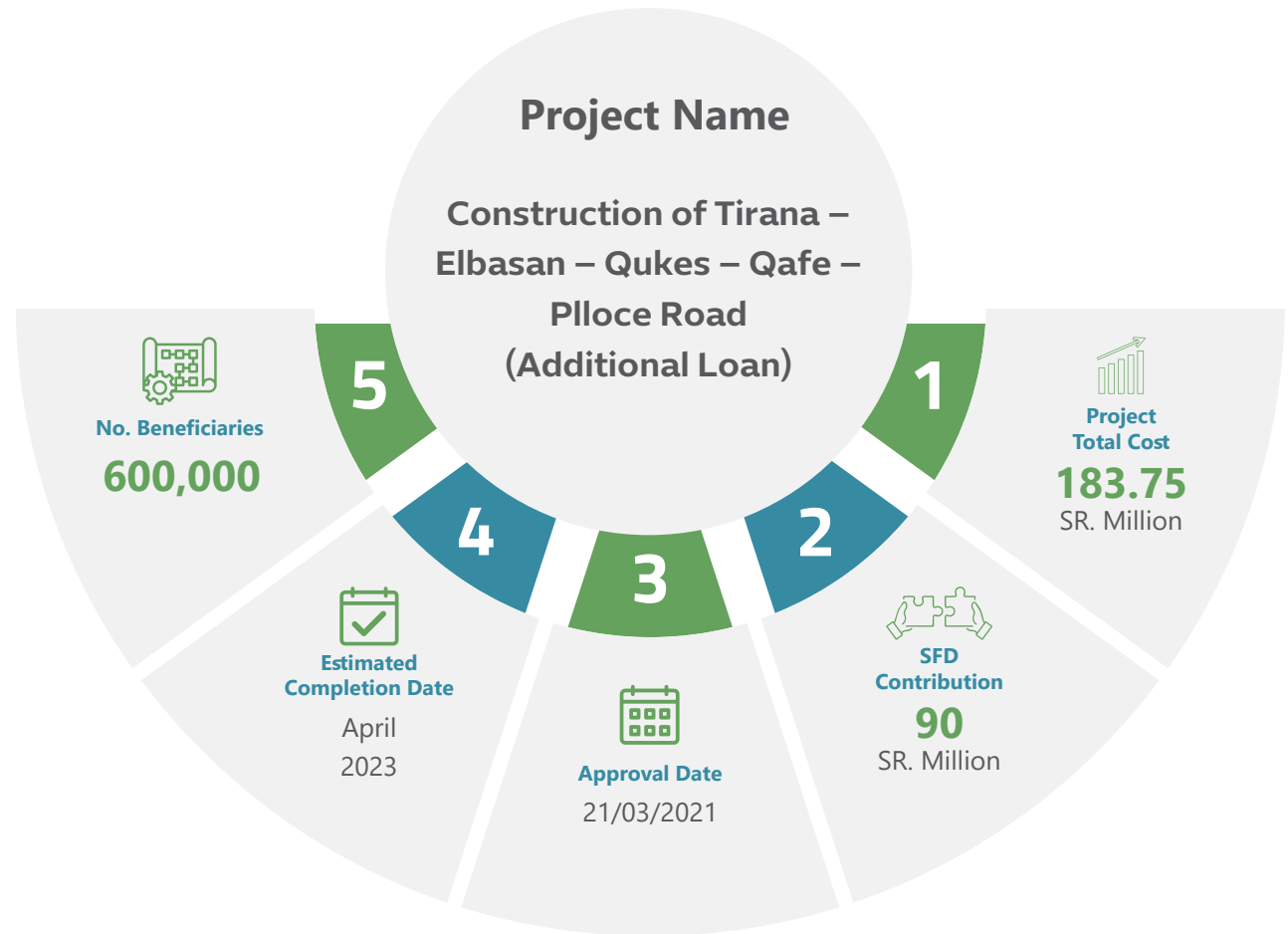
The project aims to increase the capacity of patients receiving cardiovascular medical care at the Heart Institute in the Republic of Uganda and thus reduce the number of cases receiving treatment abroad. This will contribute to improving health care provided at Uganda Heart Institute in a timely manner and raising awareness of people about the magnitude of cardiovascular disease in Uganda. The project includes increasing the number of health workers who are highly qualified in heart disease prevention and treatment and training health workers by holding specialized courses and workshops in cardiovascular medical care.



Albania

Project Description and Objectives

This project aims to face the increasing demand for transportation, and improve road conditions to attract tourism and business. The project is a continuation of Tirana – Elbasan – Qukes – Qafe – Plloce Road project. It links the capital with the border villages until it reaches neighboring countries such as Greece and Macedonia, by constructing 43.4 km road. SFD contributes to the financing of the last part of the project with a length of 9.6 km including the financing of consulting services.

SFD Cumulative Contributions

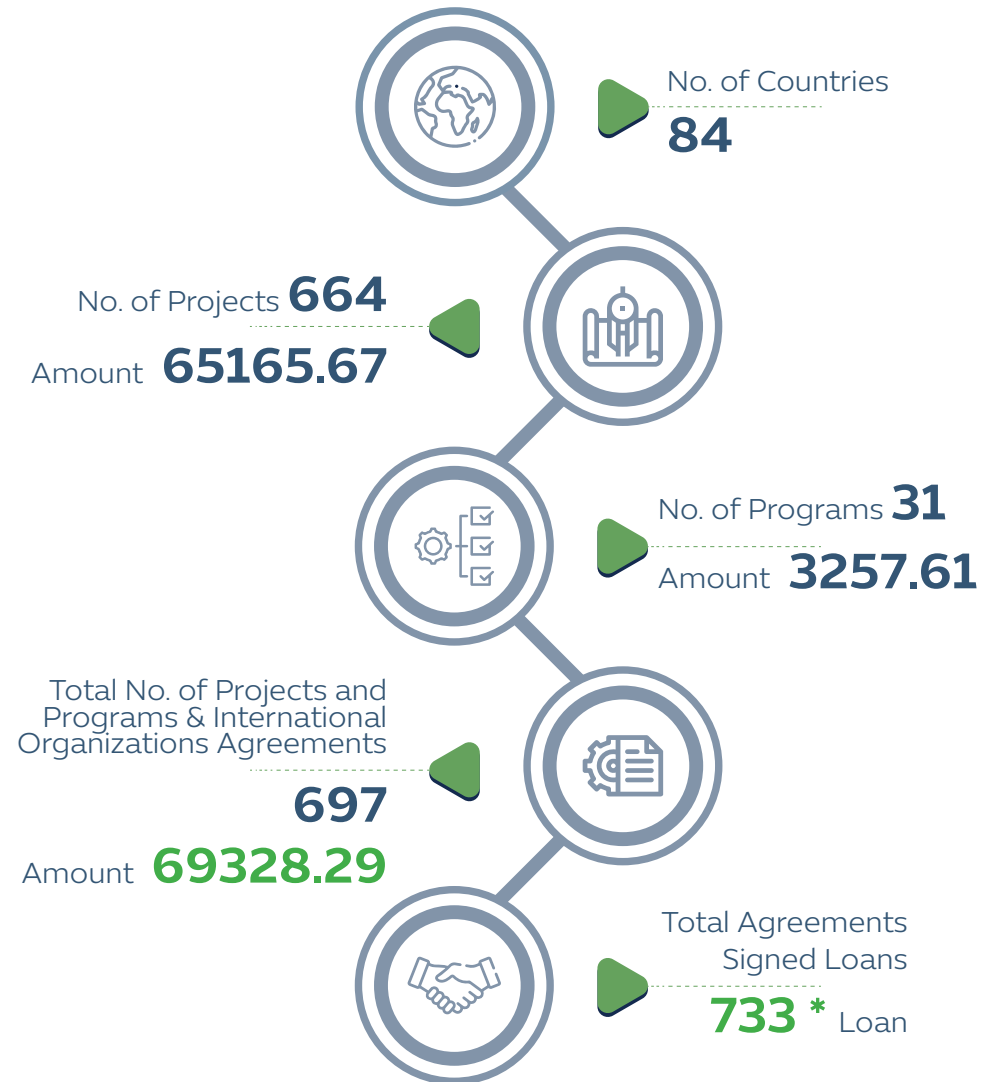
Since its inception in 1975 and up to the end of 2021, SFD had financed 733 development loans to finance 695 development projects and programs for the benefit of 84 developing countries worldwide. In Addition, SFD signed two financing agreements with International Development Association (IDA), with a total amount of SR. 905.01 million. Thus, the total amounts provided by the SFD reach SR. 69328.29 million, as illustrated in the following graph:

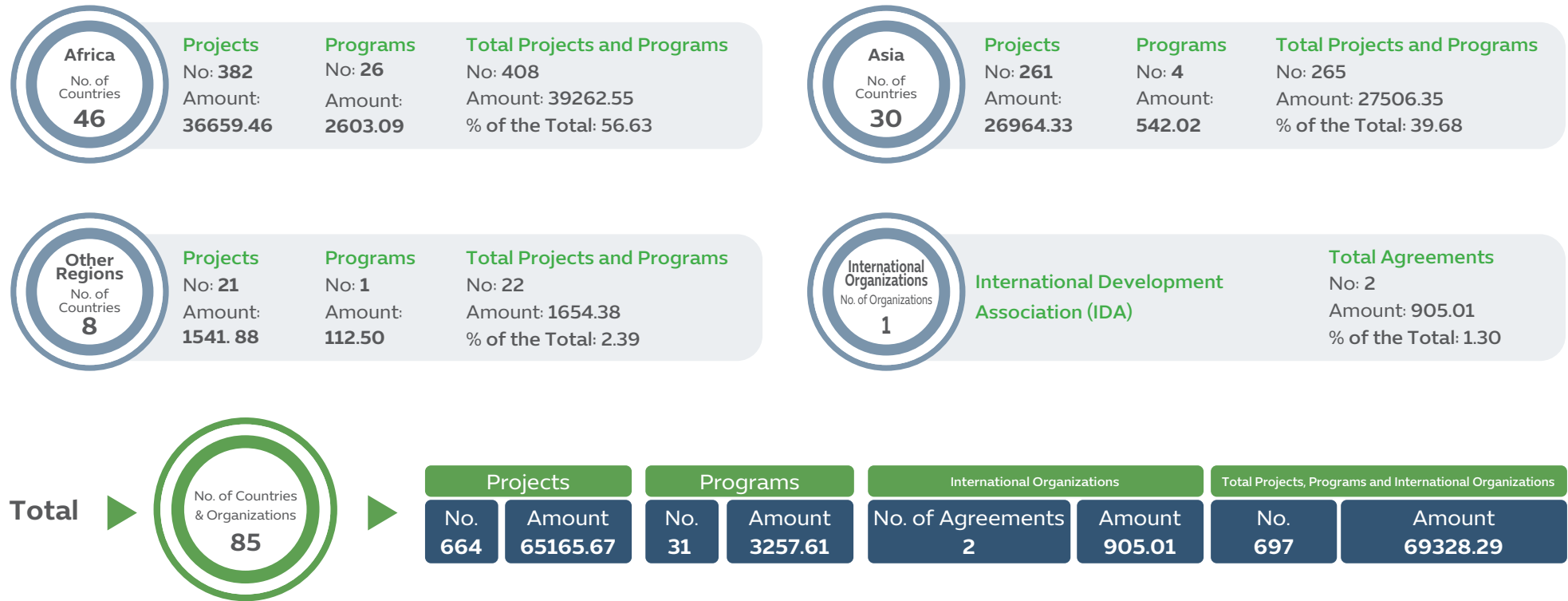

Geographical Distribution of Total Number and Amount of SFD Projects and Programs

The SFD's development policy focuses on geographically distribution of its loans to the poorest and least developed countries. Based on this principle, the Fund directed its developmental activity to Africa and Asia due to the low economic and developmental level, in addition to the increasing rates of population growth and unemployment and the reduced rates of income in African and Asian countries. Accordingly, SFD contributed to the financing of 408 development projects and programs in 46 African countries with a total amount of SR. 39262.55 million. In addition, SFD contributed to the financing of 265 development projects and programs in 30 Asian countries with a total amount of SR 27506.35 million. When it comes to Other Regions, SFD contributed to the financing of 22 development projects and programs totaling SR. 1654.38 million, from which 8 countries across the world benefited. SFD signed two financing agreements with the International Development Association (IDA), in a total amount of SR. 905.01 million.

Sectorial Distribution of Total Number and Amount of SFD Projects and Programs

SFD seeks to provide the financing necessary for the development projects in developing countries. Its primary focus is placed on the sectors of infrastructure and productivity. Since the Fund began its loan activities in the mid - seventies to the end of 2021, number of development projects and programs financed in the transport and communication sector reached 227. The social infrastructure came in the second place with 225 development projects and programs. The agriculture sector came in next place with 97 projects and programs, followed by the energy sector with 76 projects and programs. In the same way, SFD contributed to the financing of 54 projects and programs in other sectors. SFD financed 16 projects and programs in the industry and mining sector, as well as SFD signed two finance agreements with international organizations.

Sectorial and Geographical Distribution of Total Number and Amount of SFD Projects and Programs

Since the inception of its development activities up to the end of 2021, SFD contributed to the financing of 695 development projects and programs in specific infrastructure sectors within the framework of development activities in Africa, Asia and other regions. The finances covered transport and communication, agriculture, energy, social infrastructure, industry and mining sectors as well as other sectors. Of the total number of development projects and programs that were financed, 408 were implemented in Africa with a total amount of SR. 39262.55 million, 265 in Asia with a total amount of SR. 27506.35 million and 22 in other regions worldwide with a total amount of SR. 1654.38 million. In addition, SFD signed two financing agreements with international organizations, in a total amount of SR. 905.01 million.

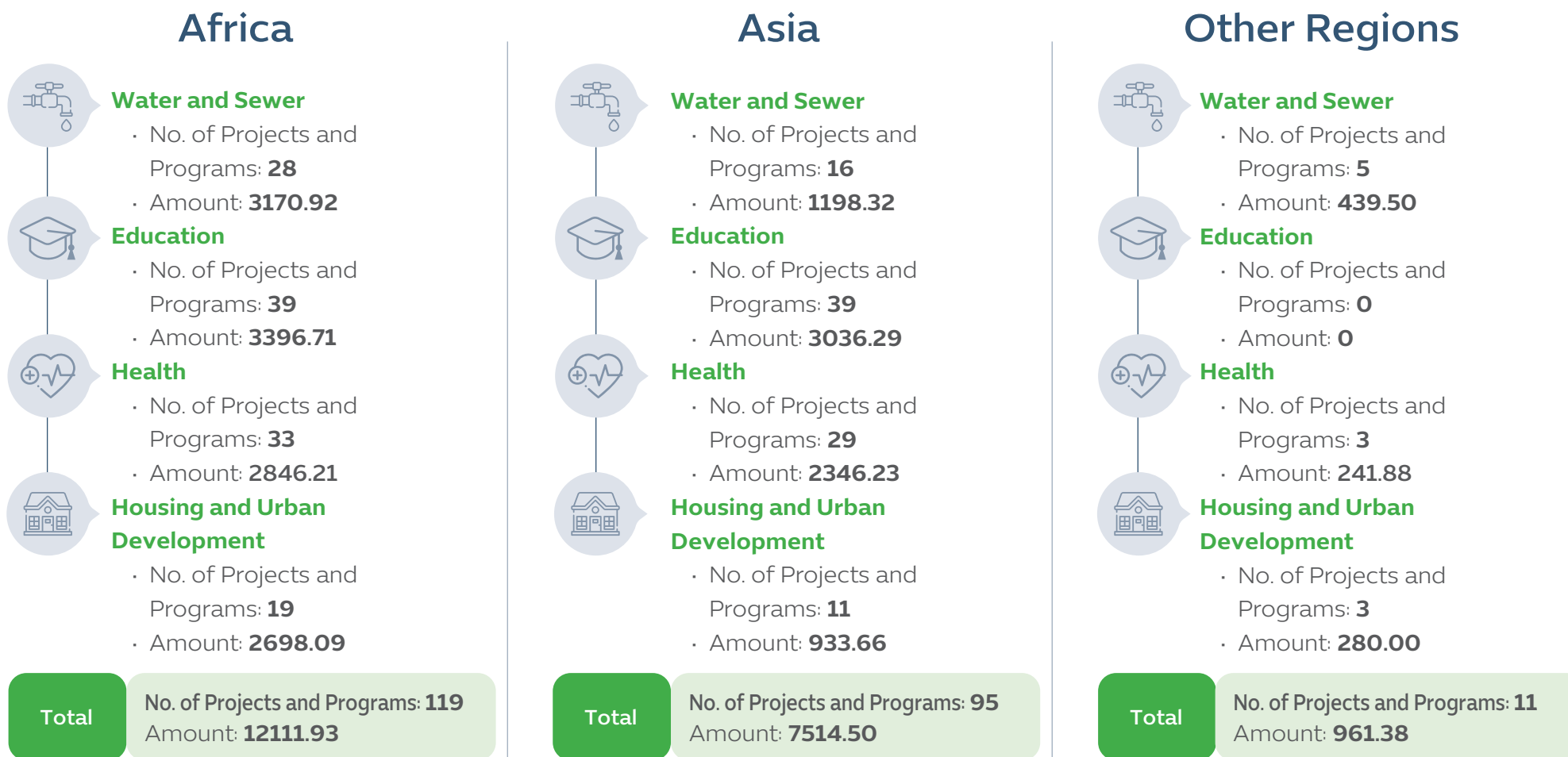

Geographical Distribution of Total Number and Amount of Social Infrastructure Projects and Programs

Believing in the importance of supporting projects in the social infrastructure sectors in the developing countries, owing to its role in developing human resources, in addition to increasing efficiency, productivity, improvement of living conditions and health of the population, the social infrastructure has topped the list of sectors financed by the SFD in terms of total loans amounted to SR. 20587.56 million, representing 29.69% of the total amounts provided by SFD to finance 225 development projects and programs, as illustrated in the following figure:

Geographical Distribution of Total Number and Amount of Transportation and Communication Projects and Programs

Recognizing the importance of the Transportation and Communication sector in the economy of the developing countries, SFD perceived the key role, which this sector plays as it links urban areas with rural areas and facilitating the movement of people and goods. The number of development projects and programs financed by the SFD in this sector totaled 227, with a total amount of SR. 19456.49 million representing 28.06% of the total amounts provided by SFD, as illustrated in the following figure:

(SR. Million)



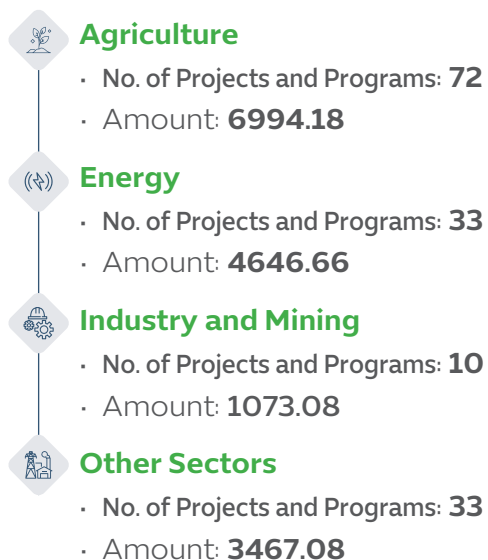
Geographical Distribution of Total Number and Amount of Projects and Programs in Other Sectors

SFD allocated part of its contributions to support the productive economic sectors, including agriculture, energy, industry and mining sectors as well as a number of other sectors and international organizations. Accordingly, SFD financed 97 development projects and programs in the agricultural sector, 72 of which were in Africa, and 25 in Asia. SFD financed 76 development projects and programs in the energy sector, 33 of which were in Africa, 42 in Asia and 1 in the other regions of the world.

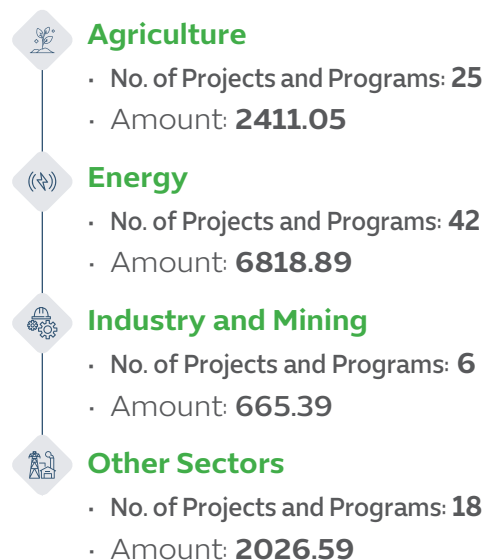
In the industry and mining sector, SFD financed 16 development projects and programs, 10 of which in Africa and 6 in Asia. Other sectors received the financing necessary for the execution of 54 development projects and programs, of which 33 were in Africa, 18 in Asia and 3 in other regions worldwide. In addition, SFD has executed two financing loan agreements with a total amount of SR. 905.01 million with international organizations.

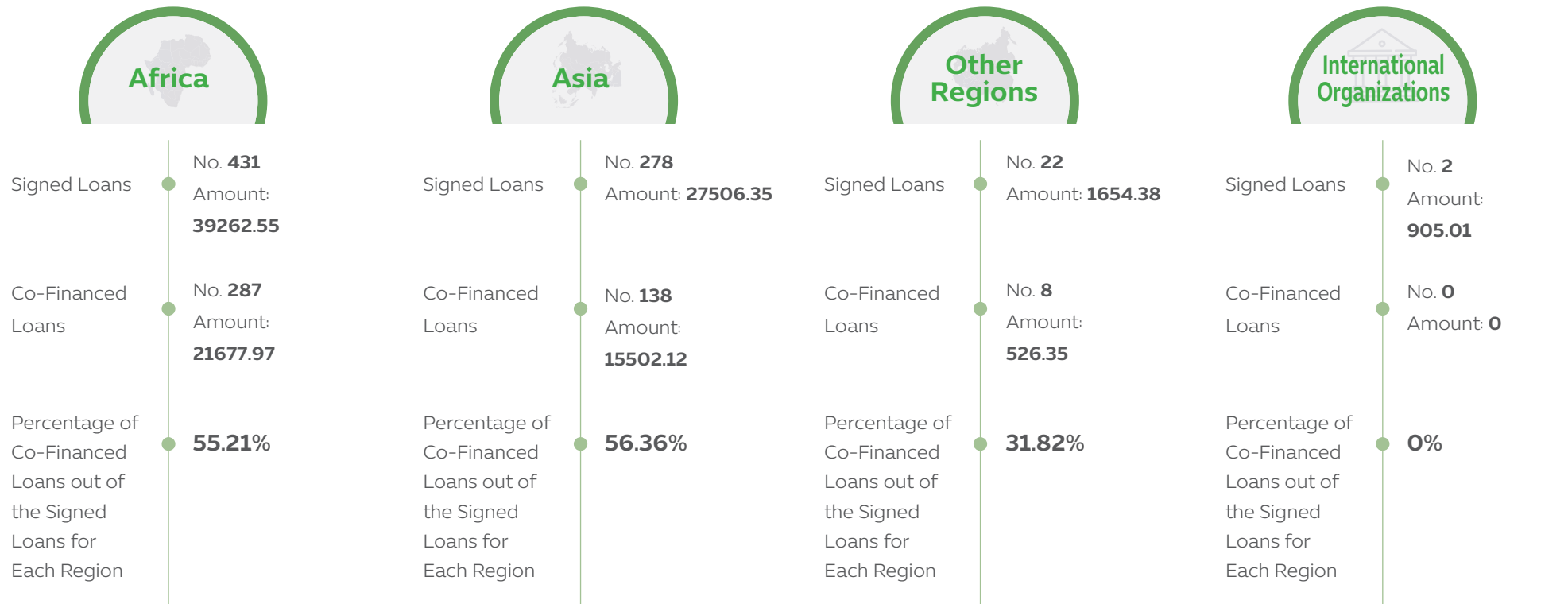

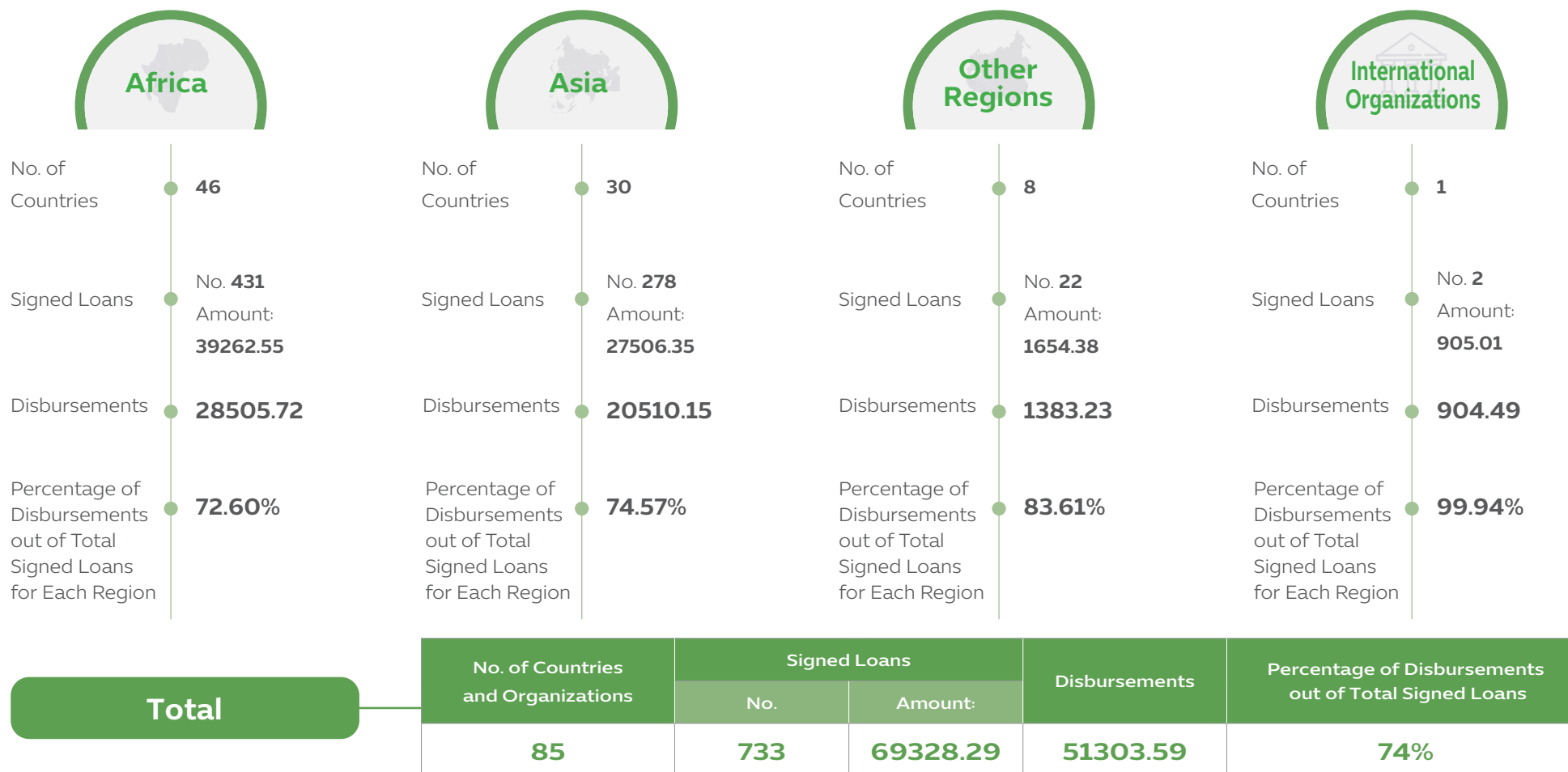

Project Under the Spotlight

SFD Efforts to Mitigate Climate Change and Preserve the Environment

1. SFD Contributions to Clean Energy Projects:

Adopting clean, renewable, and alternative energy is essential to achieving economic and social development. Given the growing challenges posed by issues related to climate change and increased emissions of gas and carbon dioxide worldwide, renewable energy is the most appropriate option for developing countries. The global changes have affected marine species and ecosystems while also contributing to increased occurrences of natural disasters, such as floods. Since the international community recognizes the importance of renewable energy and its role in reducing carbon emissions worldwide, the SDG 7 "Affordable and Clean Energy" of the 2030 Sustainable Development Goals has set the following goals to be achieved by 2030: Ensure universal access to affordable, reliable and modern energy services, increase substantially the share of renewable energy in the global energy mix, double the global rate of improvement in energy efficiency, enhance international cooperation to facilitate access to clean energy research and technology, including renewable energy, and promote investment in energy infrastructure and clean energy technology, expand infrastructure and upgrade technology for supplying modern and sustainable energy services for all in developing countries, in particular

least developed countries, small island developing States, and landlocked developing countries. Recognizing the importance of supporting and developing the renewable energy sector, the Saudi Fund for Development focused on contributing to this sector. From its inception and up to the end of 2021, SFD financed 15 loan agreements in the renewable energy sector across nine developing countries, by establishing and improving 11 dams

producing hydroelectric energy, including the diversion of river paths and construction of barriers, dams, and generators to transform hydropower into a source of sustainable, renewable, and clean energy. The total loans provided for this purpose amounted to SR. 2440.60 million, representing 22.08% of the total contributions allocated to the energy sector. The total power necessary to operate the renewable energy projects amounted to 41,940 mw.

A- Supporting Clean Renewable Energy Projects in Africa:

SFD has played a significant role in enhancing renewable energy as it has supported seven projects in seven African nations: Burkina Faso, Sudan, Ghana, Guinea, Cameroon, Kenya, and Madagascar. These projects have been implemented through 9 loans agreements with a total amount of SR. 1240.96 million. The renewable energy projects in Africa are as follows:

1. The Merowe Dam Project in Sudan:

SFD has contributed to the financing of the merowe dam project in sudan by signing two loan agreements, one of which was an additional loan, with a total amount of SR. 788 million. this project aims to meet the increasing demand for electricity and cover the deficit in its production by constructing a dam near meroe to collect water from the Nile river and use that water to generate electrical power, estimated to be 1250 mw.

2. The Kpong Hydro-Electric Power Plant Project in Ghana:

SFD has signed a loan agreement of SR. 114.70 million to finance the Kpong Hydro-Electric Power Plant Project in Ghana. This project aims to build a dam on the Volta River, include a basic unit to generate electricity with a total capacity of 160 mw, and construct a dual transmission line with a voltage of 161 kv connecting the base station to the authority's network. this project will help Ghana cope with the increasing costs of fuel prices, as well as meet the people's demand for electric power.

3. The Song Loulou hydroelectric Power Plant Project in Cameroon:

SFD has signed a loan agreement with SR. 105.90 million to finance the Song Loulou hydroelectric Power Plant Project in Cameroon. This project aims to meet the needs of the aluminum industry in Cameroon and neighboring countries by building a dam on the Sanaga River and a 180 mw power plant.

4. The Garafiri Dam for Hydro-Electric Power Plant Project in Guinea:

SFD has contributed SR. 110 million to finance the Garafiri Dam for Hydro-Electric Power Plant Project in Guinea. This project aims to meet the increasing demand for electric power in the Conakry and Mamo regions by establishing a 75 mw power plant.

5. The Andekaleka Hydro-Electric Power Plant Project in Madagascar:

The Fund provided a loan of SR. 42.40 million to finance Andekaleka Hydro – Electric Power Plant Project in Madagascar. This project aims to meet the demand for energy by constructing a concrete dam of 10 meter high and 125 meter long and establishing a 28 mw power plant.

6. The Kompienga Dam Project in Burkina Faso:

SFD has contributed SR. 40 million to finance the Kompienga Dam Project in Burkina Faso. This project aims to transmit electrical power to Ouagadougou, by building a 40 meter high earthen dam on the Kompienga River, to generate 40 gw.

7. The Kiambere Hydro-Electric Power Plant Project in Kenya:

The Fund has financed Kiambere Hydro-Electric Power Plant Project in Kenya with SR. 39.96 million. This project aims to build a dam on the Tana River, which is 35 km away from Kindaruma Hydro-electric Station, to generate 140 mw.

B- Supporting Clean Renewable Energy Projects in Asia:

SFD has played a significant role in Asia. It signed six loan agreements for renewable energy in two countries: Pakistan and Nepal, with a total amount of SR. 1199.64 million. The renewable energy projects in Asia are as follows:

1. The Marsyangdi Hydro–Electric Power Plant Project in Nepal:

SFD has contributed an amount of SR. 45.40 million to finance the Marsyangdi Hydro – Electric Power Plant Project in Nepal. this project aims to meet the demand for hydroelectric power in the capital and the neighboring cities in Nepal until 1999 by building a diversion dam on the marsyangdi river, which is 110 km away from the west of the capital, kathmandu.

2. The Budhi Ganga Hydro–Electric Power Plant Project in Nepal:

SFD has granted a loan of SR. 112.50 million to finance the Budhi Ganga Hydro – Electric Power Plant Project in Nepal. This project aims to support the energy sector in the country by increasing electricity generation capacity to help achieve development goals, such as increasing school enrolment rates, improving health, and meeting residents' needs.

3. The Construction of the Golen Gol Hydropower Plant in Pakistan:

SFD contributed to the financing of this project by signing two loans agreements, one of which was an additional loan with a total amount of SR. 366.75 million. The project aims to establish a Hydropower Plant on the Golen Gol River. The project includes the supply, installation, and operation of 3 generating units with a total capacity of 106 mw. The plant consists of a concrete wall 60 meters long and 12 meters high to divert water from a 220 meter long open channel.

4. The Establishment of Neelum Jhelum Hydropower Plant Project in Pakistan:

SFD has contributed to the financing of the Neelum Jhelum Project In Pakistan by signing two loan agreements, one of which was an additional loan, with a total amount of SR. 675 million. this project aims to meet the increasing demand for electrical power in The Azad Jammu And Kashmir Region by establishing Neelum Jhelum Hydropower Plant near Muzaffarabad, the capital of the province. by diverting water from The Neelum River to the power generation station site in Chatter Kalas, south of Muzaffarabad, and linking the new plant with Pakistan's national electricity network, the project contributes to overcoming the increasing deficit in electric power. the project also contributes to reducing dependence on the production of high-price thermal energy, improving the standard of living in the region, improving the economic situation, preserving the environment, and providing clean and low-cost energy.

2. SFD Contributions to Support Environment Preservation Projects

Due to the global increasing interest in the environmental affairs during the past fifty years, and specifically during the past ten years, environmental pollution has become an issue that contribute to creating problems for countries, especially developing ones, because of its short and long-term dangerous effects on human life. Environmental problems and climate change have negatively contributed to many natural phenomena that have had negative impacts on natural resources and air pollution.

International development efforts, whether by governments or international institutions, have contributed to preserving and caring for the environment, with a focus on raising the healthy environment level in all aspects of life for individuals in order to have a healthy life. In this sense, SFD realized the importance of the environment in raising the quality of life in developing countries. This prompted SFD to finance a number of flood protection projects in developing countries, with a total amount of more than SR. 563.87 million. In addition, SFD has contributed to a number of afforestation and forestation projects in developing countries, with total loans amounted to SR. 49.67 million. SFD also had a role in enhancing food security by financing several agricultural reclamation projects in many countries, with a total amount of SR. 1774.60 million. SFD's contributions in those areas are as follows:



Maputo Coastal Protection Project in Mozambique

A- SFD Contributions to Support Flood Control Projects

1. Maputo Coastal Protection Project in Mozambique:

SFD contributed to the financing of this project with an amount of SR. 37.50 million. the project aims to provide a suitable environment for the economic and social development of Mozambique. the project plays a significant role in strengthening the country's efforts in this regard, especially as it improves the standard of living for the residents of the capital by reducing the deterioration of Maputo Beach, protecting investment facilities and public and private properties along the beach, and encouraging tourism and fishing activities.

2. The Protection of The Coastline from Drift in Carthage, Gammarth, and Halg Alwadi in Tunisia:

SFD contributes to the financing of this project with an amount of SR. 70 million. this project aims to protect beaches affected by marine drift as well as the nearby businesses and social facilities, such as homes, hotels, service networks, roads, coastal forests, and agricultural lands. it also aims to alleviate the salinity of groundwater and limit the migration of affected people to other regions.

3. The Protection of Cities and Urban Areas from Flood in Tunisia:

SFD financed this project with an amount of SR. 228 million. this project aims to protect cities and urban areas from floods, through the rehabilitation and construction of reinforced concrete channels of different sizes, rehabilitation of rainwater collection basins, construction of an earthen canal in the northern and eastern region of Greater Tunis, and rehabilitation and construction of water facilities in Gabes Valley, Qarab Valley, Roerich Valley, Al Zeer Valley, And Al Khaleej Valley, and rehabilitation of the roads and green areas. the project includes the excavation and backfilling works and the removal of old installations.

4. The Repairs Program for the Damages that Resulted from Tsunami in the Maldives:

SFD provided SR. 56.25 million for this project. it aims to repair damages caused by the tsunami disaster in the Maldives by improving the infrastructure and providing advisory services to the affected areas.

5. Rehabilitation of Flood Affected Areas in Vietnam:

SFD contributed to the financing of this project with an amount of SR. 60 million to develop the infrastructure in the area by improving traffic movement, protecting the local population from floods, and facilitating transportation and rescue operations in the Nam Dan District in the Nghe An Province.

6. The Infrastructure Development Project for Flooded Affected Communes of Ha Tinh Province in Vietnam:

SFD contributes to the financing of this project with an amount of SR. 56.25 million. the project aims to respond to climate change by redeveloping the infrastructure of the flood-affected areas in Hatin Governorate, stabilizing the development of the affected regions through protecting the region and population from floods, providing a safe environment to combat fluctuating climate conditions, improving the traffic and facilitating the movement of citizens to boost the economy.

7. The Infrastructure Development Project in Dong Thap Province in Vietnam:

SFD contributes to the financing of this project with an amount of SR. 55.88 million. the project aims to develop the infrastructure and agricultural areas to respond to climate changes in Ku Lao Te, Tan Bana, and Dung Thap Provinces. by improving the rural infrastructure, the project contributes to the country's economy, facilitates mobility, and protects several areas from floods.

B- SFD Contributions to Afforestation and Forestation Projects

1. Mugamba – Bututsi Reforestation Project in Burundi:

SFD provided an amount of SR. 8.70 million to finance Mugamba – Bututsi reforestation project. this project aims to protect soil from erosion resulting from heavy rains. the project also aims to enhance wood wealth by reforesting 10,000 hectares, including 2,000 hectares as an experimental area.

2. Forestation Project in Eritrea:

SFD contributed an amount of SR. 40.97 million in this project, with the aim of increasing the production of agricultural crops in eritrea, and protecting and reforming lands that have been subjected to severe erosion, abuse and deforestation in many areas of the country.

C. SFD Contributions to Agricultural Land Reclamation Projects:

1. The Algharb Agricultural Project in Morocco:

SFD financed this project with an amount of SR. 115 million. this project aims to construct 18 pumping stations, two power centers, irrigation networks, a dam to control river water, and 11 agricultural investment centers. the project will also carry out land leveling works and provide spray equipment. it also aims to transform the natural irrigation system in 45,500 hectares into an intensive industrial irrigation system to increase agricultural production in Morocco.

2. The Nefzaoua Oasis Project in Tunisia:

SFD supported this project with an amount of SR. 50 million. this project aims to utilize the groundwater in the Nefzaoua Region in southern Tunisia in order to reclaim old oases for a total area of 4,904 hectares (including reclaiming new oases with a total area of 1,070 hectares). this project contributes to increasing agricultural production and improving the income of residents of the region, creating new job opportunities, and protecting the environment from the dangers of drought and desertification.

3. The Irrigation Agriculture Development on Senegal River Project in Senegal:

SFD contributed to the financing of this project with an amount of SR. 45 million. this project aims to reclaim agricultural land by pumping water through open channels along the left bank of the Senegal River.

4. The Rehabilitation and Extension of Matam Agricultural Project in Senegal:

SFD contributed SR. 74.20 million intending to increase reclaimed agricultural areas in Matam for the ultimate goal of improving and diversifying irrigated crops, creating jobs, investing in rural areas, and contributing to agricultural, economic, and social development.

5. The Land Reclamation Project in Messon Toffiye Region in Togo:

SFD contributed to the financing of this project with an amount of SR. 17 million. the project aims to rehabilitate 360 hectares of existing farms and prepare 300 hectares of new farms to help improve the living conditions of 4500 citizens in Messon Toffiye.

6. The Arkiz Agriculture Project in Mauritania:

SFD has financed this project with an amount of SR. 127.50 million. this project aims to reclaim 350 hectares of agricultural land in the eastern basin of The Arkiz Plain, reclaim 220 hectares in the western basin of arkis plain, and rehabilitate 1000 hectares in the Western Basin of Arkis Plain. this will help reduce poverty rates by sustainably raising agricultural production capacity and creating thousands of jobs in the region. the project will also improve farmer's income while also raising the efficiency of the water system and agricultural land.

7. Al Mahsamma Tertiary Wastewater Treatment Plant Project in Egypt:

SFD contributed to this project with an amount of SR. 790 million. this project aims to provide the necessary water for the agricultural sector in the Ismailia Governorate, south of the New Suez Canal in the east of the country. the project will utilize the wastewater of Al-Mahsamma to reclaim 250 million square meters of agricultural land.

8. The Construction of (13) Agricultural Zones Project in Egypt:

SFD contributed SR. 394.98 million to this project to develop the agriculture sector in the Sinai Peninsula by reclaiming and cultivating 23 million square meters. in addition, the project aims to employ human capital for development purposes and provide job opportunities for young people in the region. this project is planned to include the construction of 13 agricultural zones, including 11 in the North Sinai Governorate and two in the South Sinai Governorate.



9. The Completion of The Bagmati Irrigation Project in Nepal:

In financing this project, SFD provided an amount of SR. 56.25 million. this project aims to complete the agricultural reclamation and irrigation system infrastructure for the 68000 hectares located in targeted areas in Sarlahi, Rautahat, and Bara.

10. The Nucleus Estate and Small Holder 4th Region Project in Indonesia:

SFD financed this project with an amount of SR. 74.62 million. this project aims to develop small farmers' lands in south Bengkulu by reclaiming and planting 6000 hectares with oil palm, and 1500 hectares to build 3000 homes for settlers and establish gardens for crops. the project also includes the provision of agricultural machinery, equipment, fertilizers, and seeds.

11. The Nucleus Estate and Small Holder Sugar Project in Indonesia:

SFD contributed an amount of SR. 30.07 million to finance this project. it aims to develop small farmers' farms in Tanah Lot, South Kalimantan, by reclaiming 7800 hectares. it also aims to establish model farms in the same area, reclaim 4600 hectares, construct a sugar factory with a capacity of 400 tons per day, improve and construct regional roads, and establish a technical assistance program to implement the project. the project improves and increases agricultural production while also settling 5000 farmers.

The Private Sector Contribution in Implementing the SFD - Financed Projects

Seeking to enhance development cooperation with the countries benefiting from SFD's loans, through engagement of the Saudi private sector having long history and accumulated experience abilities and capabilities in the implementation of infrastructure projects in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, many Saudi companies have participated in tenders for the implementation of projects that the SFD contributes to their finance in a competition with many international companies. The Saudi private sector participated in the

implementation of some projects financed by SFD during the fiscal year (2021). The signed contracts amounted to SR. 682 million, representing 48% of the total signed contracts within framework of loans and grants financed by SFD and with the participation of 13 Saudi companies.

During the financial year (2021), SFD registered and qualified 81 companies and institutions in the field of engineering consultancy, contracting and supplies. SFD also communicated with a group of Saudi companies and institutions. 158

companies expressed their interest to enter into 36 projects. They were transferred to the operations sector to complete these participations.

In the fiscal year (2021), the Saudi private sector benefited from the implementation of some projects financed by SFD. Number of the Saudi contracts reached 16, representing 10.6% of the total contracts, amounting to SR. 1109 million, representing 48.1% of the total amounts of contracts according to the reservation.
