The Activity of the Saudi Fund for Development in Supporting Water Sector





The Kingdom of Saudi Arabia is one of the main countries that provide development financial assistance to a broad range of developing countries in order to elevate their economy. In fact, the Kingdom truly believes that those countries are in desperate need for help and that cooperation and solidarity between the international community members is inevitable. This role has grown and expanded with the growing capabilities and capacities of the Kingdom. In this regard, KSA ranked first among the world countries in terms of the percentage of their assistance to their Gross National Product.

The Saudi Fund for Development represents the government's main channel through which the Kingdom provides assistance. Given that the Kingdom's policy is based on the importance of cooperation and the provision of help to developing countries, and also in support of the efforts to increase the economic growth rates and reduce poverty. The Fund has endeavored to offer assistance to a wide number of developing countries, within this framework, the Fund, since its inception in 1974 till the end of 2013, has contributed a total amount of SR. 42323.00 million, equivalent to US\$ 11286.00 million to finance 542 development projects and programs in 81 countries.

The water sector stands as one of the key sectors to which the Fund has contributed assistance. In doing so, the Fund essentially aimed to provide clean drinking water, irrigation and agriculture; alongside with the improvement of the sewerage system. By doing so, the Fund contributed to the reduction of the developing countries' problems in this field, particularly the wide-spreading of diseases and the increase in the number of deaths due to the lack of clean potable water or adequate sewerage systems.



The Fund dedicated importance to the water sector. In line with this context, it has financed 40 projects with SR. 2939.51 million, about US\$ 783.87 million, which represents 6.95% of the Fund's total contributions. 37 countries in each of Africa, Asia and Other Regions of the world benefitted from the Fund's projects in the water sector. In Africa, the Fund financed 23 projects with about SR. 1848.33 million while in Asia 14 projects were financed with SR. 921.68 million. The Fund also participated in the finance of 3 projects in Other Regions with a total of SR. 169.50 million.











African Countries Recieved Finance in Water Sector Projects [SR. Million]





Saudi Program for Digging Wells and Rural Development in Africa

In 1981, The Government of Saudi Arabia announced its special program for digging wells and rural development in Africa. The SFD managed this program through supervising the provision of grants that were distributed over five stages. Implementation of the first stage began in 1982 while the fifth one shall be started throughout the current year, 2014. The total assistance allocated for these grants amounted to almost SR. 1237.50 million equivalent to US\$ 330 million.
