# Overview of the Saudi Fund for Development SFD



## Incorporation

The Saudi Fund for Development (SFD) was established by Royal Decree No. (M/48), issued on 14/08/1394 H (01/09/1974). It began operations on 18/02/1395 H (01/03/1975).



## Vision

SFD seeks to be a comprehensive strategic partner that advances the sustainable economic development of the world's least developed countries.



## Mission

SFD empowers the stable economic development of countries in need by leveraging the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia's resources to provide financial, technical and human support to meet the needs of its partners.



## Objectives

As defined in its Law, SFD's main objective is to finance development projects in developing countries by providing the necessary loans and technical support for studies and institutional development.



## Management and Organization

SFD is a public institution and an independent legal entity with financial autonomy. It is overseen by a ten-member Board of Directors. The CEO holds executive authority and is responsible for implementing the Board's decisions.



## Capital

SFD began operations with a capital of USD 2.66 billion provided by the Saudi government. This capital later tripled through three phases, reaching USD 8.26 billion.



In the presence of H.E. Ahmed bin Aqeel Al-Khateeb, Chairman of the Board, a USD 55 million development loan agreement was signed to finance the Earthquake Risk Mitigation Project for several public schools in Türkiye

## Scope of Activity

### Financing Development Projects

SFD's primary activity is to provide soft loans without territorial limitations. SFD works directly with the governments of developing countries to finance priority development projects, with a focus on the least developed and low-income nations.

- SFD's Law outlines the core rules for providing development loans.
- Development loans are used to finance key projects.
- The following conditions must be met to qualify for SFD loans:



The project must be shown to be economically or socially feasible.



Full project financing must be secured before the loan is granted.



The loan must be paid and repaid in Saudi riyals.



The loan amount granted to any project shall not exceed 5% of SFD's capital.



The total loan amounts granted to any country in one time shall not exceed 10% of SFD's capital.

## First: Signed Loan Agreements

In fiscal year 2024, SFD signed 17 development loan agreements with 13 countries to finance priority projects, totaling USD 987.13 million. This included 2 loans in Africa (USD 90 million), 5 loans in Asia and the Pacific (USD 306 million), 4 loans in Europe (USD 219.13 million), and 6 loans in Latin America and the Caribbean (USD 372 million). It is Notably, SFD expanded its lending activity this year to include five new countries: Saint Kitts and Nevis, El Salvador, Nicaragua, Dominica, and Serbia, as shown in the figures.

## Second: Sectoral Distribution of Signed Loans

In fiscal year 2024, SFD directed its loans toward several key development sectors, including social infrastructure, energy, transportation and communications, agriculture, and others. The social infrastructure, energy, and transportation and communications sectors each received five loans, accounting for 31.20%, 29.28%, and 26.86% of total funding, respectively. Additionally, SFD financed one loan in the agriculture sector and another in a other sectors, representing 7.60% and 5.06%, respectively, as shown below:

#### Project Name

#### Mitigating Earthquake Risks in a Number of Public Schools

##### Objectives and Description of Project

This project aims to support the education sector in the Türkiye by developing and rehabilitating several public schools in Istanbul. It focuses on strengthening their resilience to earthquakes to create a safer learning environment for students and teachers. The project involves constructing five public schools across an approximate area of 55,000 square meters, equipped with modern technologies to help resist and mitigate earthquake risks. It also ensures the continued operation of these schools while enhancing their overall quality and efficiency.

### Project Name

#### Renewal and Development of Railways Used in Transporting Phosphate

##### Objectives and Description of Project

This project aims to renovate and upgrade part of the phosphate transportation railway network in the Republic of Tunisia by increasing its capacity to transport larger quantities of phosphate and its derivatives. The project is expected to support the national economy by creating direct and indirect job opportunities for citizens, reducing pressure on road infrastructure, and limiting traffic congestion and accidents. It will also promote local and urban development in the areas along the railway route. The project includes the renewal of two sections of the railway network: the first covering 62 kilometers of railway lines, and the second covering 129 kilometers. It also involves the establishment of a factory to manufacture concrete railway sleepers.

#### Establishment of Shounter Hydropower Station

##### Objectives and Description of Project

This project aims to support and strengthen the energy sector in the Republic of Pakistan by constructing the Shounter Hydropower Station with a production capacity of 48 megawatts, and connecting it to the national electricity grid. The station is located on the Pearl River, approximately 138 kilometers from Muzaffarabad City in the Azad Jammu and Kashmir region. It aims to meet the region's growing electricity needs, support economic and social development, and provide reliable power for a range of activities. The project includes the construction of a dam, a main canal, water diversion and purification systems, a powerhouse, and a tunnel to discharge water back into the river. It also covers the provision of equipment, turbines, generators, transformers, and transmission lines.

#### Establishment of Jagran-IV Hydropower Station

##### Objectives and Description of Project

This project aims to provide electric power in the Republic of Pakistan by establishing a 22-megawatt hydropower station on the Jagran River, located 120 kilometers from Muzaffarabad City in the Azad Jammu and Kashmir region. The station will be connected to the national electricity grid. Once completed, the station will supply electricity for various economic activities, supporting economic and social development and helping to deliver essential services to citizens. The project involves building a dam, a water diversion and purification facility, a 110-meter-long intake canal, a powerhouse, and a tunnel to discharge water back into the river. It also includes equipment and systems required for operation, such as a turbine, four generators, transformers, electromechanical equipment, and transmission lines to the first Jagran station.

##### Objectives and Description of Project

This project aims to strengthen the electric power sector in Saint Kitts and Nevis by expanding the existing Needsmust Power Plant through the construction of an additional dual-fuel facility with an 18-megawatt capacity. The new facility will generate flexible hybrid energy, improving production efficiency and enabling the use of clean fuels to support the country's transition to a sustainable, low-emission energy future. The project also involves supplying and installing smart electricity meters in homes and facilities using radio frequency technology, as well as replacing approximately 21,500 existing meters.

This project aims to strengthen infrastructure in Saint Vincent and the Grenadines by constructing and rehabilitating buildings and facilities damaged by natural disasters across key sectors, including housing, health, education, sports, and national security. It includes rebuilding homes, equipping four health facilities, and constructing schools and government offices. The project also involves furnishing these buildings and equipping them with the necessary tools and technologies to enhance their sustainability and resilience against natural disasters and climate change.

The terminal will improve passenger flow and increase the airport's capacity to 7 million passengers annually, with future expansion potential up to 15 million. The project also aims to provide air freight services to facilitate the importing and exporting of goods, thereby supporting trade activities in the country. The terminal will be designed to reflect the Maldives' unique identity and tourism appeal, contributing to both the sector's growth and the national economy. The funding of this project builds upon a previous initiative supported by SFD in 2016, which aimed at developing the air transportation sector and accommodating the ever-increasing number of passengers and tourists.

##### Objectives and Description of Project

The project aims to enhance healthcare services in the Republic of Nicaragua by establishing the Carlos Centeno Hospital in Las Minas, with a total area of 25,000 square meters and a capacity of 310 beds. The hospital will serve residents of Las Minas and nearby communities, including Rosita, Bonanza, Molokuku, and Paywas. The project includes the construction of a two-story facility housing essential clinics such as emergency, surgery, pediatric immunization, and inpatient care. It will also feature administrative offices, a training department, and a general services unit. The project will also include a laboratory for clinical and analytical testing.

#### The Pristina - Mitrovica Highway (Additional Loan)

##### Objectives and Description of Project

The project aims to improve the transportation sector in the Republic of Kosovo by linking the capital, Pristina, with the cities of Mitrovica and Vushtrri. This will be achieved by upgrading the M2 Highway from a single-lane road in each direction to a dual-lane highway. This highway is one of the most heavily trafficked and congested roads in the Kosovo network, with approximately 27,000 vehicles crossing this road daily. This project builds on a previous initiative funded by SFD in 2013, which sought to improve the highway by easing traffic flow, enhancing safety, and reducing accidents. It also aimed to support economic and social development across the region and create both direct and indirect job opportunities.

The project is expected to support both commercial and residential growth, stimulate real estate investment, and boost national economic returns. It also includes road construction, paving, lighting, landscaping, and the reinstatement of underground utilities, including sewage, electricity, and telecom networks.

The project supports Serbia's energy sector by developing the electric power transmission grid to improve efficiency, reliability, and capacity. It also aims to strengthen power supply security and quality while encouraging investment in renewable energy in Serbia and neighboring countries. This will be achieved by constructing two overhead transmission lines: one measuring 77 km and the other 3 km, which will help deliver sustainable, efficient, and reliable energy, promote economic growth, and reduce greenhouse gas emissions.





## Geographical Distribution of the Total Number and Amount of SFD's Loans

SFD has contributed to financing 458 development loans in Africa, benefiting 47 countries, with a total amount of USD 11,555.96 million. In Asia and the Pacific, SFD financed 289 development loans for 31 countries, with a total value of USD 8,090.76 million. ## Sectoral Distribution of the Total Number and Amount of SFD's Loans

SFD has provided development loans across a range of infrastructure sectors, including social infrastructure, transportation and communications, agriculture, energy, industry and mining, and other sectors. Social infrastructure received the highest number of loans, with 270 development projects financed. ## SFD's Role in Supporting Developing Countries in Combating Desertification

Desertification, drought, and land degradation are among the most pressing challenges facing developing countries in their efforts to achieve the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). These issues directly affect efforts to eradicate hunger and poverty, ensure water for irrigation and agriculture, and maintain food and water security. They also negatively impact biodiversity, vegetation cover, ecological balance, and global social and economic stability. Human activities that worsen desertification and drought include agricultural expansion, intensive land use, unsustainable irrigation, deforestation, and overgrazing. These practices result in soil and land degradation, reduced vegetation cover, loss of animals adapted to arid and semi-arid environments, and declining water resources, including groundwater levels and dried-up wells and springs. Annually, approximately 50,000 square kilometers of land become unsuitable for agriculture due to desertification and drought. 40% of global agricultural land is at risk of desertification and drought, threatening the livelihoods of over a billion people worldwide.

Desertification and drought affect every continent except Antarctica. Most areas affected by desertification are in developing countries, particularly across Africa, Asia, Latin America, and the Caribbean. Desertification and drought pose serious threats to livelihoods by directly impacting economic and social systems, worsening living conditions for millions and limiting access to essential resources like food, water, and energy. They are also a major cause of resource and income shortages, driving up poverty rates and worsening socio-economic conditions. In many cases, this leads to the displacement of millions of people.



As desertification and drought worsen, their impact on sustainable development in developing countries has intensified, raising environmental, social, and economic concerns. As a result, these challenges have attracted global attention, emphasizing the urgent need for stronger international cooperation to combat desertification at both national and global levels. This can be achieved by adopting effective programs and policies to mitigate their environmental, social, and economic impacts. In this context, the United Nations Convention to Combat Desertification (UNCCD) is one of the most significant international environmental agreements adopted by the international community to address and combat desertification and drought in countries suffering from these problems, especially in Africa. The Convention was prepared by the UN's Intergovernmental Negotiating Committee and endorsed in Paris on 17 June 1994. The Convention entered into force in 1996 and was signed by 197 parties, representing 196 states and the European Union. The Convention primarily addresses the issues of desertification, land conservation, sustainable land management, and reclamation. It serves as a bridge between environmental and developmental concerns, linking them to climate, biodiversity, and food security. June 17 is recognized annually as the "World Day to Combat Desertification and Drought," aimed at raising awareness among people and promoting the implementation of this Convention, especially in countries suffering from desertification and drought issues.



Joint action by the international community and development institutions is essential to combat desertification and drought and to mitigate their negative effects on developing countries. SFD has a long-standing record of supporting efforts to combat desertification and drought, particularly through loans in the water and sanitation sector. In this regard, SFD has financed 60 development projects that include drinking water systems, water distribution networks, and wastewater treatment. SFD has also provided 104 loans for irrigation, covering the construction of agricultural dams, irrigation canals, land reclamation, and afforestation. Moreover, SFD has provided 91 loans related to construction of dams and generation of hydroelectricity and solar energy. SFD also manages and finances the Saudi Program for Digging Wells and Rural Development in Africa, which has been implemented in five phases since the early 1980s and is still being implemented. The following section highlights SFD's contributions to supporting developing countries in their efforts to combat desertification and drought.

## SFD Contributions to Providing Drinking Water and Sewerage Services

Developing countries face significant challenges in providing clean water and treating wastewater in both urban and rural areas. These difficulties are compounded by the scarcity and pollution of water resources, rapid population growth, weak infrastructure, and a lack of funding for related projects. As a result, SFD has contributed to easing these burdens across many regions of the world. To address these needs, SFD has financed a range of development projects, including seawater desalination, water network expansion and distribution, wastewater treatment facilities, and the rehabilitation of water supply systems. Among the most prominent projects financed by SFD in this field are the Project of Nouakchott Water Supply from the Senegal River in the Republic of Mauritania, the Greater Baku Water Supply Rehabilitation Project in the Baku region in the Republic of Azerbaijan, the Seawater Desalination Project in the Republic of Malta, and the Project of Rehabilitating the Drinking Water Network for Havana in the Republic of Cuba. The following table presents SFD's contributions in this sector, categorized by geographical region.




## SFD Contributions to Providing Water for Agricultural Purposes

SFD is dedicated to supporting water projects that serve agricultural needs, particularly in areas affected by desertification, drought, and water scarcity. This comes in recognition of the importance of water in enhancing agriculture, increasing agricultural production, and achieving food security. To this end, SFD has funded a variety of projects, including land reclamation and rehabilitation, the construction of agricultural dams and irrigation canals, and afforestation initiatives. Key agricultural projects funded by SFD include the reclamation and development of water basins on the islands of Santiago, Sant'Anto, and Boavista in Cape Verde; irrigation and drainage of left bank land of Indus river in Pakistan; and the Irrigation Infrastructure Enhancement and Agricultural Reclamation Program in several regions of Serbia. 


## SFD Contributions to Providing Water for Energy Production

Since the start of its lending operations, SFD has played a leading role in supporting water-related clean energy projects, particularly those focused on renewable energy. These projects help mitigate the effects of water-related challenges such as desertification and drought. They also promote equitable water access, support environmental sustainability, and provide irrigation water for agriculture. In this context, SFD has financed a variety of projects, including the construction of hydropower dams, solar power plants, and wastewater treatment facilities designed to produce biogas energy. Key energy projects funded by SFD include the Kpong Hydroelectric Power Station in Ghana, the Neelum–Jhelum Hydropower Plant in Pakistan, the Development of the Electricity Transmission Grid in Serbia, and the establishment of a Solar Power Station in Belize. ## Saudi Program for Digging Wells and Rural Development in Africa

The Kingdom launched the Saudi Program for Digging Wells and Rural Development in Africa in 1981 in response to the needs of African countries. The program was designed to directly mitigate the impact of drought on rural communities across the continent. It was implemented with the aim of drilling and equipping drinking water wells for rural populations. The program was carried out in five phases between 1981 and 2017, with a total allocation of USD 330 million.

As part of the program, more than 10,000 water installations were drilled and equipped. These included deep wells with solar-powered pumping systems, water tanks, distribution networks, wells with open pumps, and others with manual pumps. More than five million people benefited from these installations. The program had a significant developmental impact, not only improving access to drinking water but also enhancing public health and social conditions in rural areas of beneficiary countries. The program has also supported agriculture and livestock development while advancing global development goals. Notably, it contributes to Goal 6 of the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs): "Ensure availability and sustainable management of water and sanitation for all". It also contributes to Goal 2 of the SDGs: "End hunger, achieve food security and improved nutrition, and promote sustainable agriculture".

## Contribution of the Kingdom's Private Sector to the Implementation of Projects Financed by SFD

SFD supports developing countries in implementing the development projects it finances. It does so by leveraging the accumulated experience and competitive advantages of the Kingdom's private sector. This support includes consulting, contracting, and the supply of goods and materials. These efforts have also contributed to the Kingdom's overall development. SFD channels these capabilities to beneficiary countries by encouraging Saudi companies to compete internationally to implement funded projects. The following overview highlights the private sector's contributions to SFD project implementation through the end of fiscal year 2024.



During the fiscal year, the Kingdom's private sector contributed to the implementation of several SFD-funded projects. A total of 22 Saudi contracts were signed, accounting for 46% of all contracts, with a value exceeding USD 383.52 million, which represents 75% of the total contract value. As shown in the following table:
