# Overview of the Saudi Fund for Development (SFD)



## Foundation:

The Saudi Fund for Development (SFD) was founded by virtue of Royal Decree No. M/48, issued on 14/08/1394 H, corresponding to 01/09/1974. It commenced operations on 18/02/1395H, corresponding to 01/03/1975.



## Management and Organization:

SFD is a general institution and legal entity of an independent financial status. It is managed by the Board of Directors composed of eleven members. SFD's CEO assumes the executive authority and the CEO is responsible for the implementation of the Board's decisions.



## Objectives:

As defined in its Law, SFD's main objective is to contribute to financing development projects in developing countries through granting them the necessary loans and technical aids needed for financing studies and institutional support.



## Capital:

SFD commenced its activity with a capital of SAR 10 billion provided by the Saudi government. This capital then tripled in three phases to reach SAR 31 billion.

## Scope of Activity

### Financing of Development Projects

SFD contributes to development projects by providing soft loans and prioritizes the financing of projects in least developed (LDCs) and low-income countries. The Fund's activities are not geographically restricted. In addition, when financing development projects, SFD deals directly with the governments of developing countries.

- SFD's charter includes the basic regulations for providing development loans.
- Development loans for financing development projects.
- The following conditions have to be met to obtain the SFD's loan:
  - A** The project to be financed in the recipient country shall be proved economically or socially feasible.
  - B** The finance of the entire project for which the loan is provided shall be available.
  - C** The loan shall be disbursed and repaid in Saudi Riyals.
  - D** The loan amount granted to any project shall not exceed 5% of SFD's capital.
  - E** The total loan amounts granted to any country in one time shall not exceed 10% of SFD's capital.

## 2. Sectorial Distribution of Signed Loan Agreements

During the year 2022, SFD continued its activity in financing development projects in sectors specified within its lending activity, including financing projects in transportation and communication, social infrastructure, and energy sectors, represented by roads, water and sewerage, health, and the clean energy sector, which are of the most importance in the development plans and programs of a number of developing countries in Africa and other regions of the world. SFD financed 2 development projects in the African continent in the road sector and 1 project each for the water and sewerage, health, and the energy sector, with a total of SR 851.25 million. SFD also financed 1 development project in other regions of the world in the road sector with a total of SR 183.75 million, as shown in the following drawing:

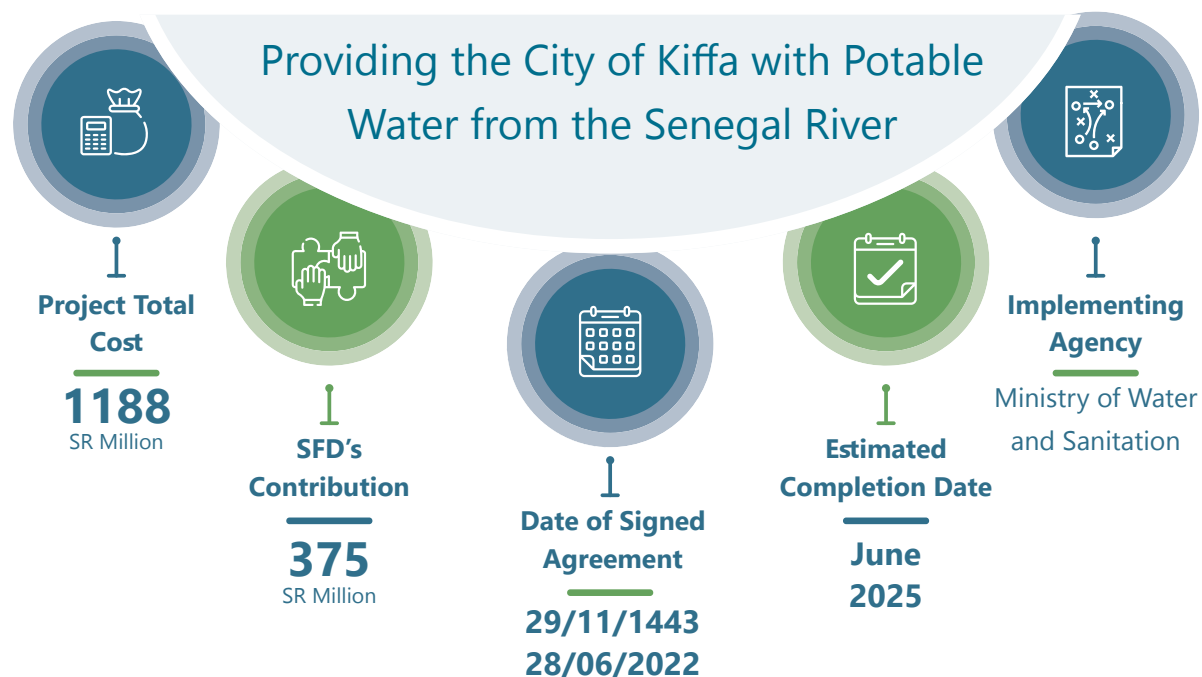
## 3. Signed Projects

### Mauritania

### Project Description and Objectives

Through supporting the water sector, the project aims to provide the city of Kiffa with potable water. The project includes the construction of a reinforced concrete water outlet on the banks of the Senegal River (Water source), and a water treatment plant with a maximum capacity of 50K cubic meters per day, covering the project scope until 2025. In addition to three main water pumps, the project includes three main concrete ground tanks and a 250 km main pipeline to transport water to Kiffa, as well as branch lines to supply elevated water tanks and water distribution networks. This also involves providing the treatment plant and pumping stations with electric power, a water laboratory, supplying and installing backup generators, and establishing a monitoring and control system in the project sites.

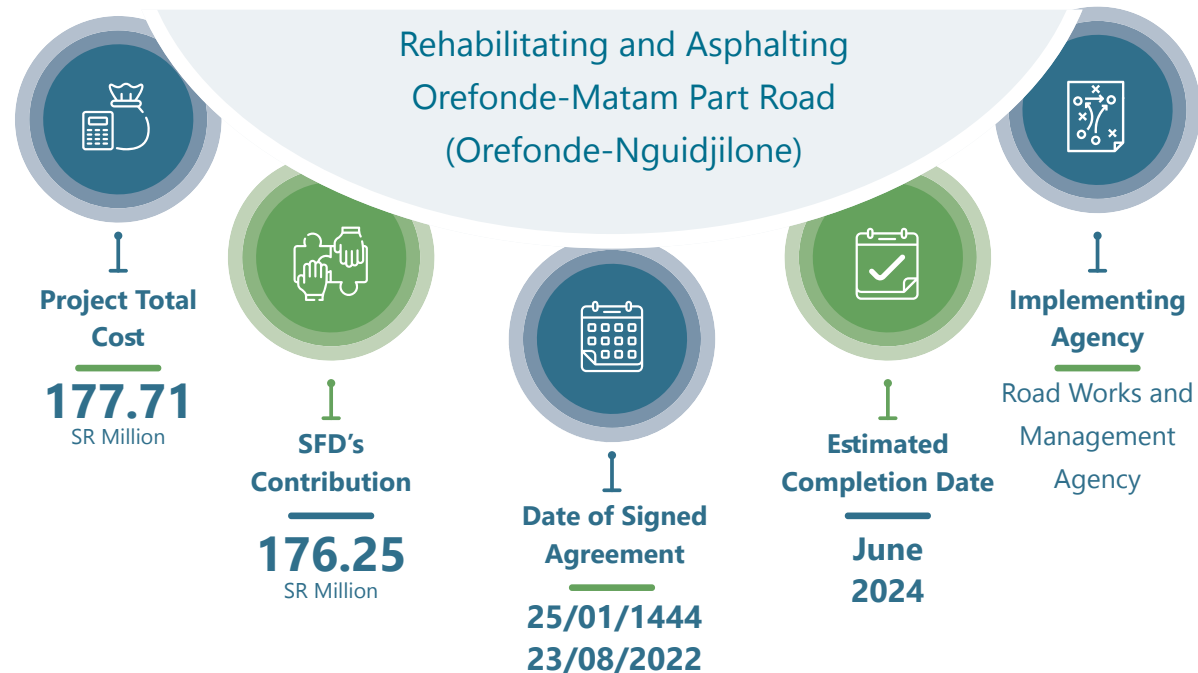


## Senegal

### Project Description and Objectives

The project aims to rehabilitate and asphalt the Orefonde - Nguidjilone Road, a 62 km long road, which is part of the 104 km Orifendi - Matam Road. The road has an operating speed of 60 km/h in urban areas and 80 km/h in rural areas. The project in its current state includes the construction of dirt tracks and the widening the current road to comply with standards approved by the West African Economic and Monetary Union.

# Senegal

## Project Description and Objectives

Through easing transportation, project aims to promote commercial activities with neighboring countries and supporting the economic and social development in the project area. Given the growing demand for passengers and freight transportation on the coastal highway from Dakar to Saint-Louis, the project also seeks to reduce travel time and minimize vehicle operations and road maintenance costs. The project includes the development of the Dakar to Tivaouane section, a 12 km long road, comprising two lanes in each direction.

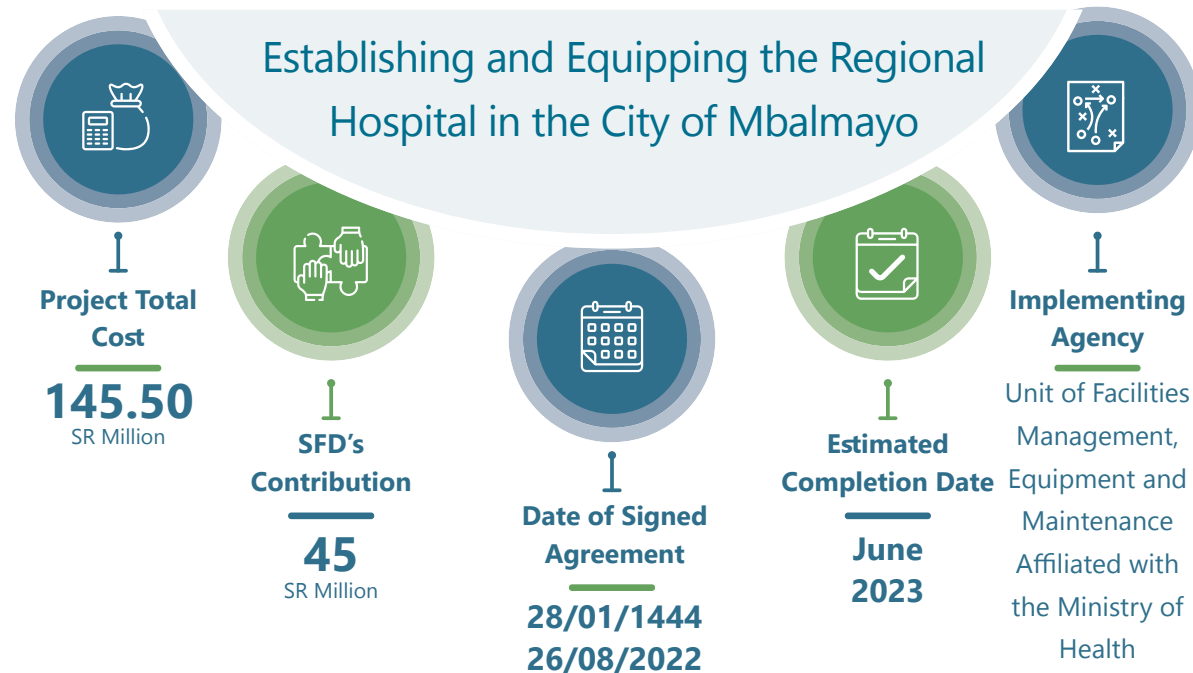


## Cameroon

### Project Description and Objectives

Through providing high-quality and enhanced healthcare services to the people of Yaounde and its environs, the project aims to accelerate the achievement of the Republic of Cameroon’s development objectives. Additionally, one of the project objectives is to relieve pressure on hospitals in “Yaounde” and “Douala”, which have been struggling in accommodating the increasing numbers of patients, particularly those in need of deep burns treatment. This will be achieved by establishing a deep burns treatment center and increasing Mbalmayo’s regional hospital capacity to 200 beds.

## Central African Republic

### Project Description and Objectives

The project aims to light Bangui (capital) road, by installing solar powered streetlights along the 70 km long road. The project includes supplying and installing lighting poles, solar energy panels, lighting lamps, solar energy storage batteries, and lighting control devices.

## Albania

### Project Description and Objectives

This project aims to complete the construction of the second part of the Tirana - Elbasan - Qukes - Qafe Plloce Road. The project will provide the shortest way to connect the capital and isolated villages with neighboring countries in the country's southern region. The enhanced road will help meet the increasing demand for transportation at present and in the future, while also improving road conditions to attract tourism and businesses. This project involves two stages, with the first being the construction of a 27 km long two-lane road that starts from the capital, Tirana, to the city of Elbasan. The second stage involves the construction of a new 43.4 km long two-lane road linking the city of Qukes and the city of Qafe Plloce.

## Saint Vincent and the Grenadines

### Project Description and Objectives

The project aims to establish a health center in the South Rivers region, which will improve the quality of the health sector and medical equipment for the country's health system, upgrade health services, create new job opportunities, enhance human resources in the health sector, and provide a health facility if there is a need for evacuation during disasters, as it is a hurricane prone area. The project also includes the creation of a 460 square meters primary care center in the South Rivers region, consisting of three floors, with 10 beds, dental clinics, AIDS monitoring and follow up, non-communicable diseases, family planning, physiotherapy and psychiatric care.

## Saint Vincent and the Grenadines

### Project Description and Objectives

This project aims to highlight and maximize the craft and handicrafts industries to contribute to the economic growth and development of the State by providing a facility for cultural presentations and craft products for tourists and citizens, which will create new and sustainable job opportunities for the local population and highlight and showcase the popular heritage of the State. The project also includes the establishment of an artistic cultural center and a market for artisanal, cultural and agricultural products to provide social and cultural activities so as to contribute to the improvement of community life aspects. It also encompasses a performing arts building, an exhibit and sale area for products, a market for artisanal, cultural and agricultural products to display and sell artisanal and agricultural products, craft and agricultural markets, as well as a cafeteria and lounge, in addition to administrative and parking areas.

# Bahamas

## Project Description and Objectives

The project aims to restore and revitalize the city center of Nassau and accelerate the region’s economic growth. In addition it aims to increase the gathering of entrepreneurs within the sector and create careers and jobs to enhance the overall visitor experience. The project includes the construction of two-floor facilities on three islands to accommodate small projects (50 on Nassau Island, 25 on Exoma Island and 25 on Grand Bahama Island), which will include tours, outbound trips, on-site test tours and retailers, as well as local traditional food outlets.



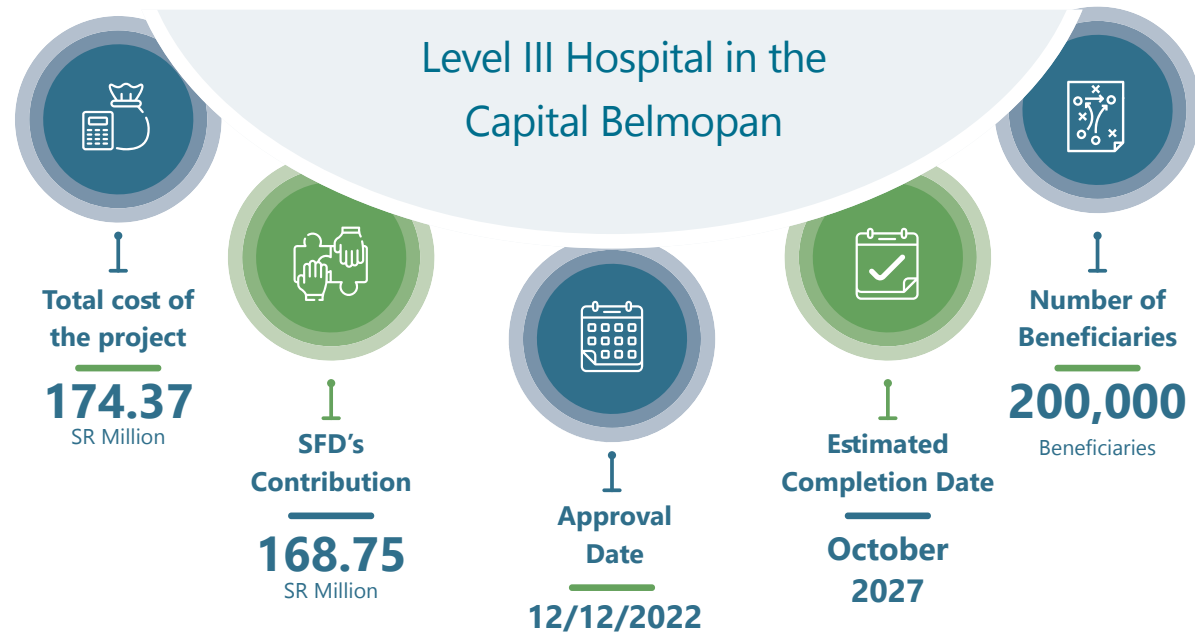


## Belize

### Project Description and Objectives

The project aims to update Belmopan's health system by providing modern infrastructure, state-of-the-art medical equipment, integrated health services, and training student health personnel at Belize University. Additionally, through establishing a third-tier hospital to serve an additional 200 patients, the project aims to alleviate the burden on Carl Hunster Hospital as well. The project includes the establishment and construction of the hospital on Belize University campus. In addition, the project includes supplying medical equipment, furniture, electrical and mechanical systems for the hospital building, as well as training of medical personnel in the use of the hospital's equipment and health system. The hospital's capacity is estimated at 150-200 beds.

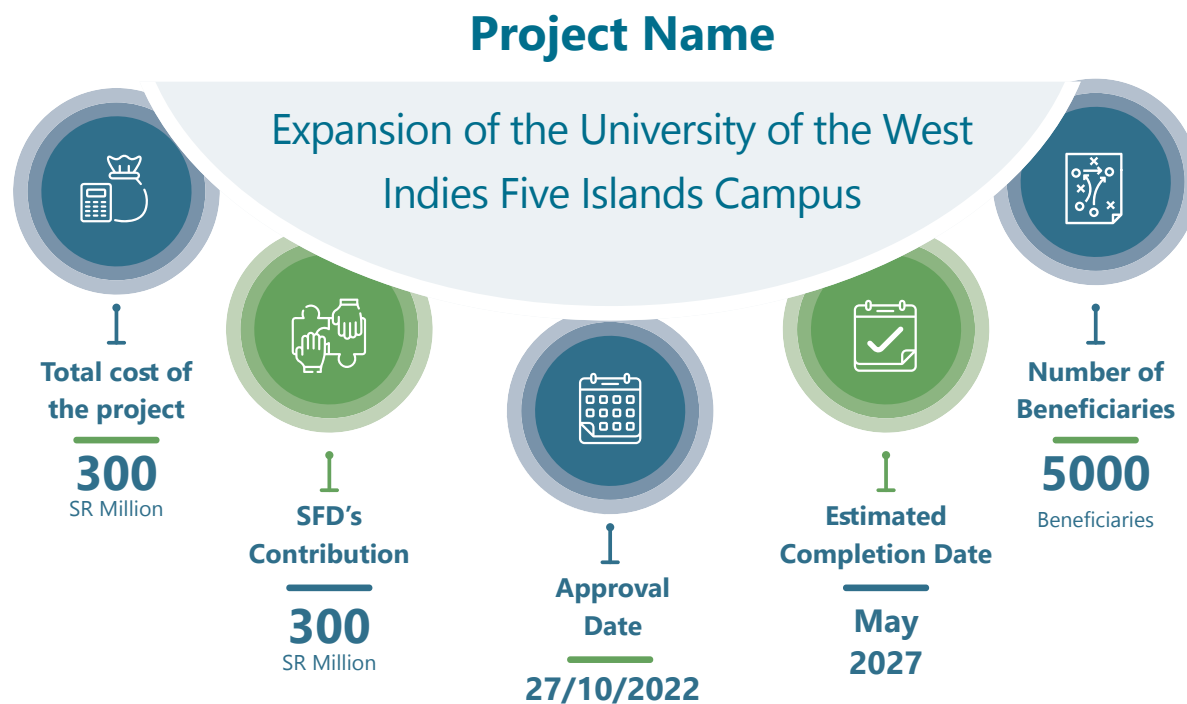

## Antigua and Barbuda

### Project Description and Objectives

The project aims to achieve Goal 4 of the Sustainable Development goals - "Quality Education" - by ensuring quality, equitable and inclusive education for all while promoting lifelong learning opportunities for all. The project includes the construction of 7 buildings with an area of 95,160 square meters. Additionally, it has been proposed that all new buildings adapt clean and innovative energy solutions through their design.





## Co-Operative Republic of Guyana

### Project Description and Objectives

This project aims to develop and grow the private sector in the sectors of building, construction and housing, provide affordable housing especially for low and middle-income people to maintain citizens' social and economic well-being, increase housing occupancy rates and facilitate establishment of public social facilities such as schools and health centers. The project includes infrastructure work for straightening out the project areas, paving main and sub-roads and their basement, extending sewage lines, installing supply and distribution lines for drinking water and electricity systems, along with road lighting and well drilling for each project area, as well as the construction of social facilities such as parks and green spaces, a health center, a police station and a fire station.

# Honduras

## Project Description and Objectives

The project aims at expanding the current two-track route to four tracks with higher technical specifications and better horizontal and vertical alignment, in a way that ensures safety of users, and contributes to increase and promote tourism. Once completed, the project will enable the economic, social and environmental development of the region. The project also includes the rehabilitation and expansion of a 30.1 Km road, consisting of four tracks, with two tracks each direction, and a width of 3.65 m per track, as well as side shoulders with a limit of 1.2 m.

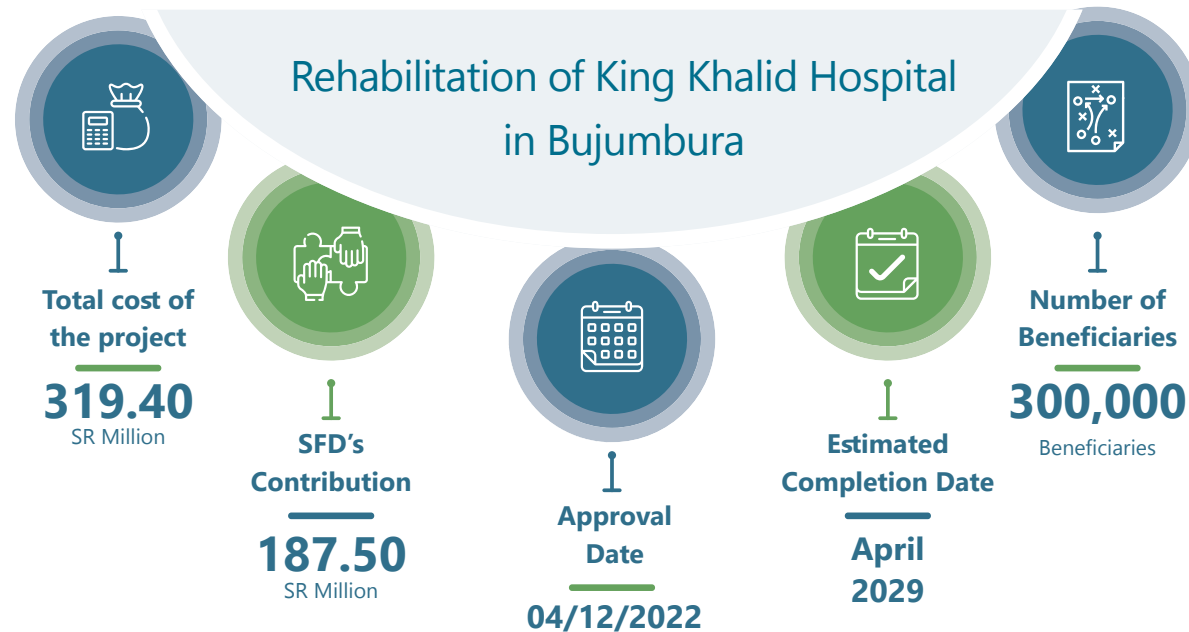


## Burundi

### Project Description and Objectives

The project aims to meet the country's needs for high-quality health services and reduce maternal, newborn, and infant mortality by reducing the mortality rate from communicable diseases, combating chronic non-communicable diseases, and increasing the hospital's capacity for training health personnel by rehabilitating and expanding the existing building of the hospital and constructing a new building that includes other departments. It also includes the rehabilitation and expansion of the existing three-floored hospital buildings with an area of 10,425 square meters and the conversion of some departments to include a pharmacy, kitchen, laundry, and departments such as (orthopedics, laboratory, nephrology, resuscitation, micro-operations, ophthalmology, radiotherapy, and blood bank). And the construction of a new, three-floored, 500 bed building on a 7000 square meters area to include outpatient clinics, hospital management, operations, hypnosis, radiology, sterilization, emergency, pediatric, and maternity clinics, a technical department, and equipping the 2 buildings with modern medical equipment.

# Seychelles

## Project Description and Objectives

The project aims to reduce social inequality, promote social cohesion, provide a more comfortable environment, and improve the living conditions of the population by delivering affordable housing facilities that provide the option of housing for low-income families in the community. This is going to be achieved through the construction of housing units in different areas of the Seychelles Republic. The project involves establishing housing units in various areas of the Republic of Seychelles. These areas include residential buildings with three or four floors. Each building contains apartments ranging from 6 to 8 apartments with an area ranging from 70 to 80 square meters. It also includes establishing utilities and public services, rainwater drainage, and sewage works for some sites.



## Seychelles

### Project Description and Objectives

The project aims to provide a modern educational environment on the island of La Digue by renovating and constructing new facilities for the existing school and providing it with new educational infrastructure facilities. The school includes preschoolers, primary and middle school students, serving 535 students. The project also includes the reconstruction of a La Digue school on La Digue Island. The construction work includes classrooms, computer classes, laboratories, teachers, offices, administrators, a medical clinic, a canteen, and restrooms, while outdoor works include a multipurpose playground with an amphitheater, a children's playground, bicycle parking areas, and stormwater drainage and sewage systems.

### Project Description and Objectives

The project aims to improve the standard of living of the inhabitants of the regions in Uzbekistan through the development of basic infrastructure and services. The project also includes the development of infrastructure in rural areas in various provinces of the country through the implementation of projects in the transportation, health, education, energy, water, sewage, and agriculture sectors.

The project also includes the construction of several buildings for 40 high schools for girls located in suitable places in the middle of rural areas and villages. Each includes dorms, a guard, supervising administration, a kitchen, and a cafeteria, all furnished and provided with restrooms, in addition to building a fence around the school to become a boarding school for girls and equipping each school with solar energy.

## Sierra Leone

### Project Description and Objectives

The project aims to contribute to the achievement of the third goal of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG's), good health and well-being, through the establishment and equipping of King Salman Referral Hospital, as the project will benefit between 250 - 300 thousand patients each year. When implemented, the project will achieve the eighth SDG on decent work and economic growth, and the eleventh SDG on the promotion of sustainable cities and communities. Finally, it will achieve the seventeenth development goal on partnerships to achieve the goals. The project also includes the construction and equipping of a new referral hospital with a capacity of 150 beds to provide high-quality health and medical care services for the population. The hospital will have essential units, such as general surgery with necessary operating rooms, emergency and pediatric, inpatient wards, obstetrics and gynecology, a nursery, and technical and administrative support units.

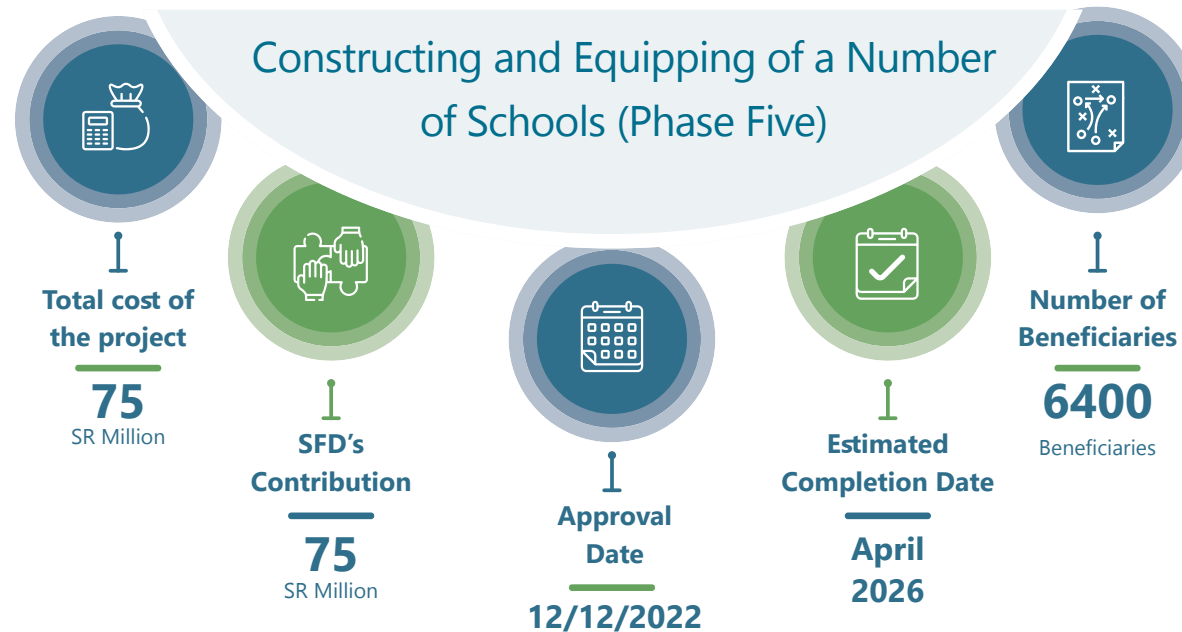


## Tajikistan

# Kyrgyzstan

## Project Description and Objectives

The project aims to improve and develop the overland communication between Kyrgyzstan and Kazakhstan by reconstructing 93 km of the Taraz-Talas International Road, because it plays an important role in raising the level of economic and social development while facilitating the movement of people and goods, as well as promoting the country’s local and foreign tourism. It is expected that the road will serve approximately 270,000 residents of the villages through which it crosses. The project also involves the re-establishment of a part of the 198 km Taraz-Talas Road. This part is located between the town of Talas up to the village of Kichi Kabka with an area of 106.6 - 197.5 km and a length of 93 km, while the current road will be re-established with its tracks expanded from 3 m to 3.75 m, with 3 m width of side shoulders. The road will also be expanded to two tracks of 3.5 m wide for each way in populated areas, in addition to lighting work and construction of side pedestrian walkways.

### Project Description and Objectives

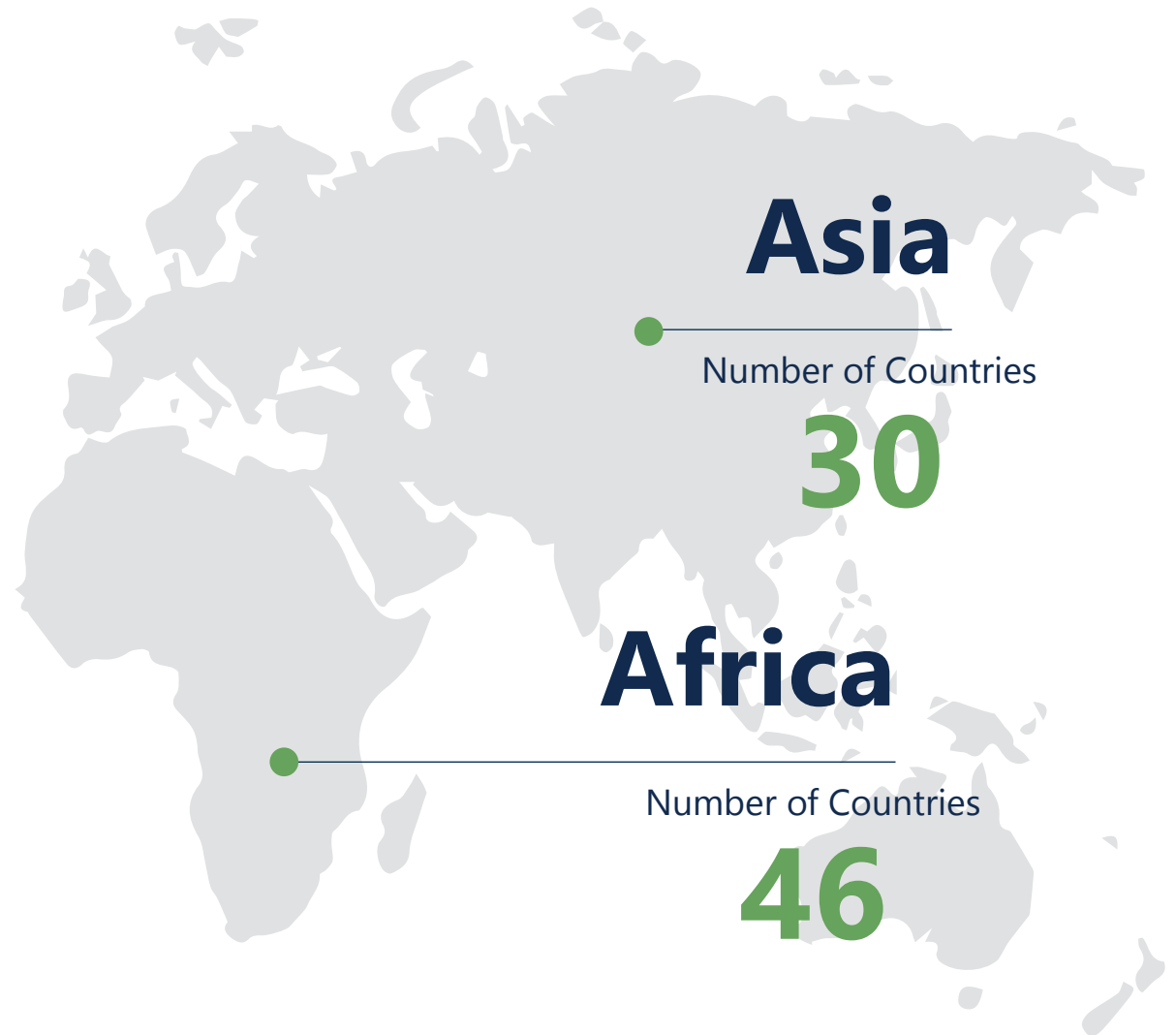
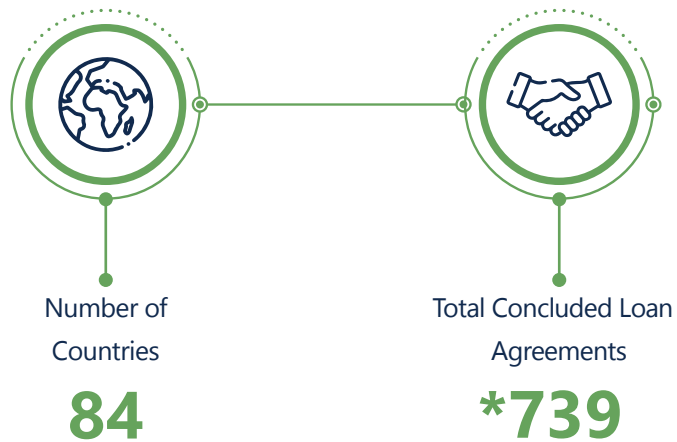

# Geographical Distribution of SFD Projects and Programs

The development policy of SFD in the geographical distribution of its assistance is based on supporting the least developed and poorest developing countries in the world. Based on this principle, SFD has directed most of its development activities towards Africa and Asia due to their low economic and developmental levels. In addition to high population growth rates, unemployment rates, and low-income rates, SFD has financed 413 development projects and programs in 46 African countries with a total of SR 40,113.81 million and contributed to the financing of 265 development projects and programs in 30 Asian countries with a total of SR 27,448.44 million. It also financed 22 development projects and programs with a total of SR 1,838.13 million, benefiting 8 countries in other regions of the world. It should be noted that SFD signed 2 financing agreements with the International Development Association (IDA) for a total of SR 904.94 million.

## Sectorial Distribution of SFD Projects and Programs

SFD is keen to provide the necessary financing for development projects in developing countries, focusing with the utmost attention on the infrastructure and production sectors, such as transportation and communications, social infrastructure, agriculture, energy, and industry and mining. The transportation and communications sectors ranked first among the sectors financed by SFD, with 229 development projects and programs. Ranking second is the social infrastructure sector, with 227 development projects and programs. Furthermore, the agriculture sector ranked third with 97 funded development projects and programs. Also, the energy sector ranked fourth with a total of 77 SFD-funded development projects and programs. In other sectors, SFD funded 54 development projects and programs. As for the industry and mining sector, SFD funded 16 development projects and programs. Lastly, SFD also signed 2 financing agreements with international organizations.

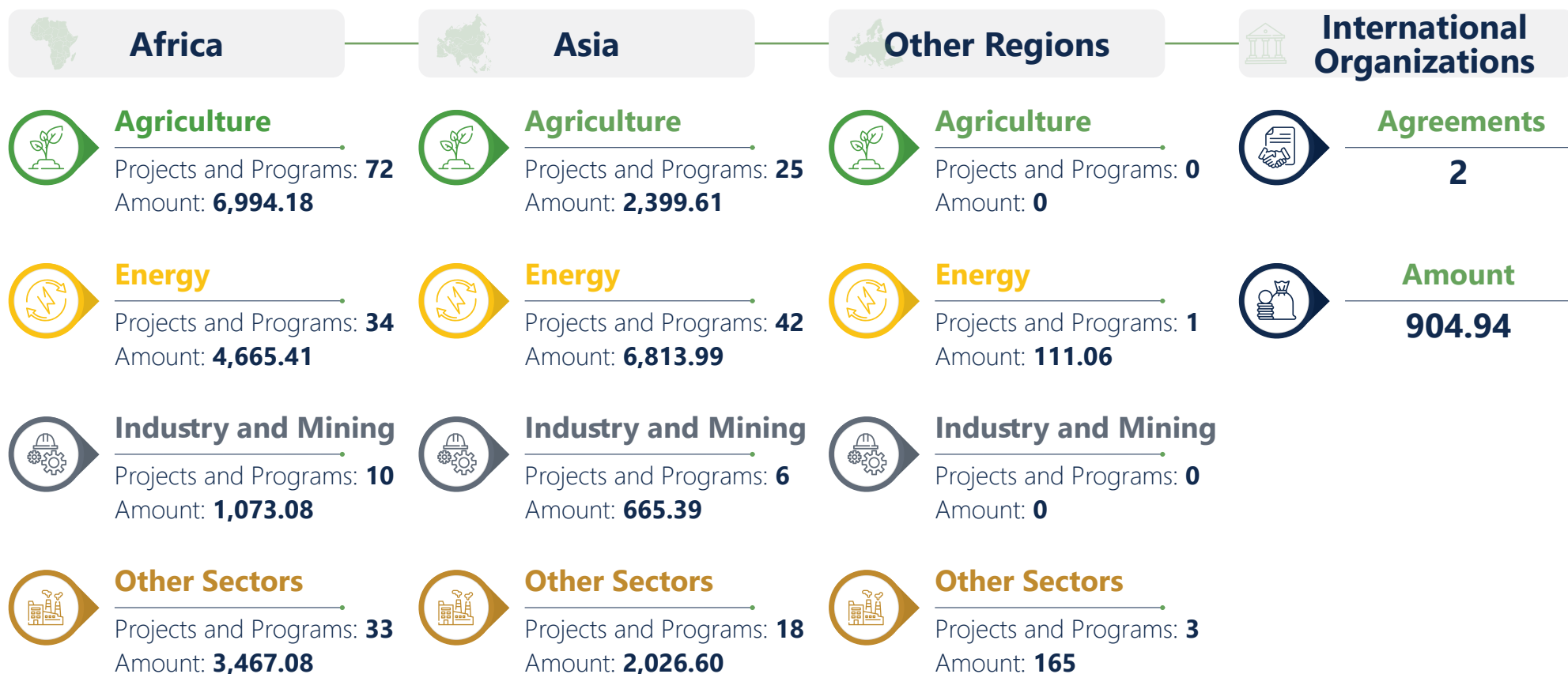

## Geographical Distribution of Projects and Programs in Other Sectors

SFD allocated part of its contributions to support the productive economic sectors represented in the agriculture, energy, industry, and mining sectors, as well as several other sectors and international organizations. The number of development projects and programs financed by SFD in the agriculture sector reached 97 development projects and programs, including, 72 in Africa and 25 in Asia. The number of development projects and programs funded by SFD in the energy sector reached 77 development projects and programs, including 34 in Africa, 42 in Asia, and 1 project in other regions of the world. In the industry and mining, SFD financed 16 development projects and programs, including 10 in Africa and 6 in Asia. 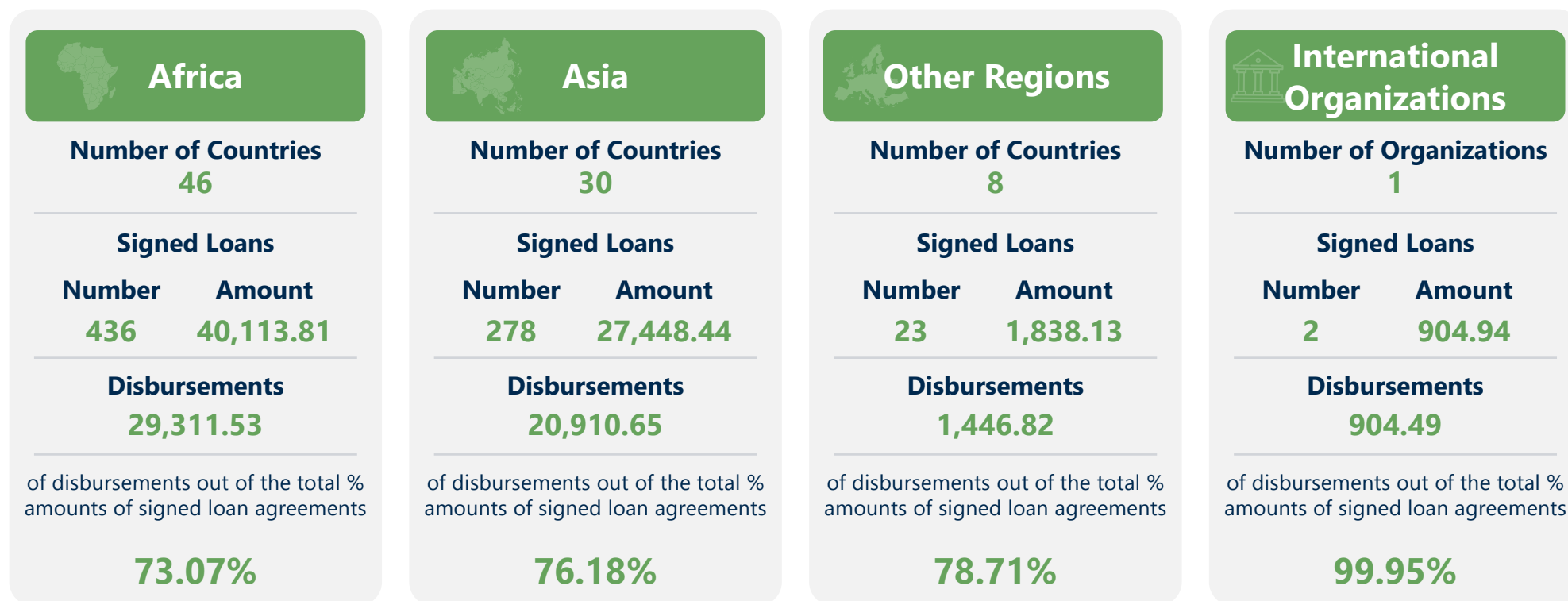

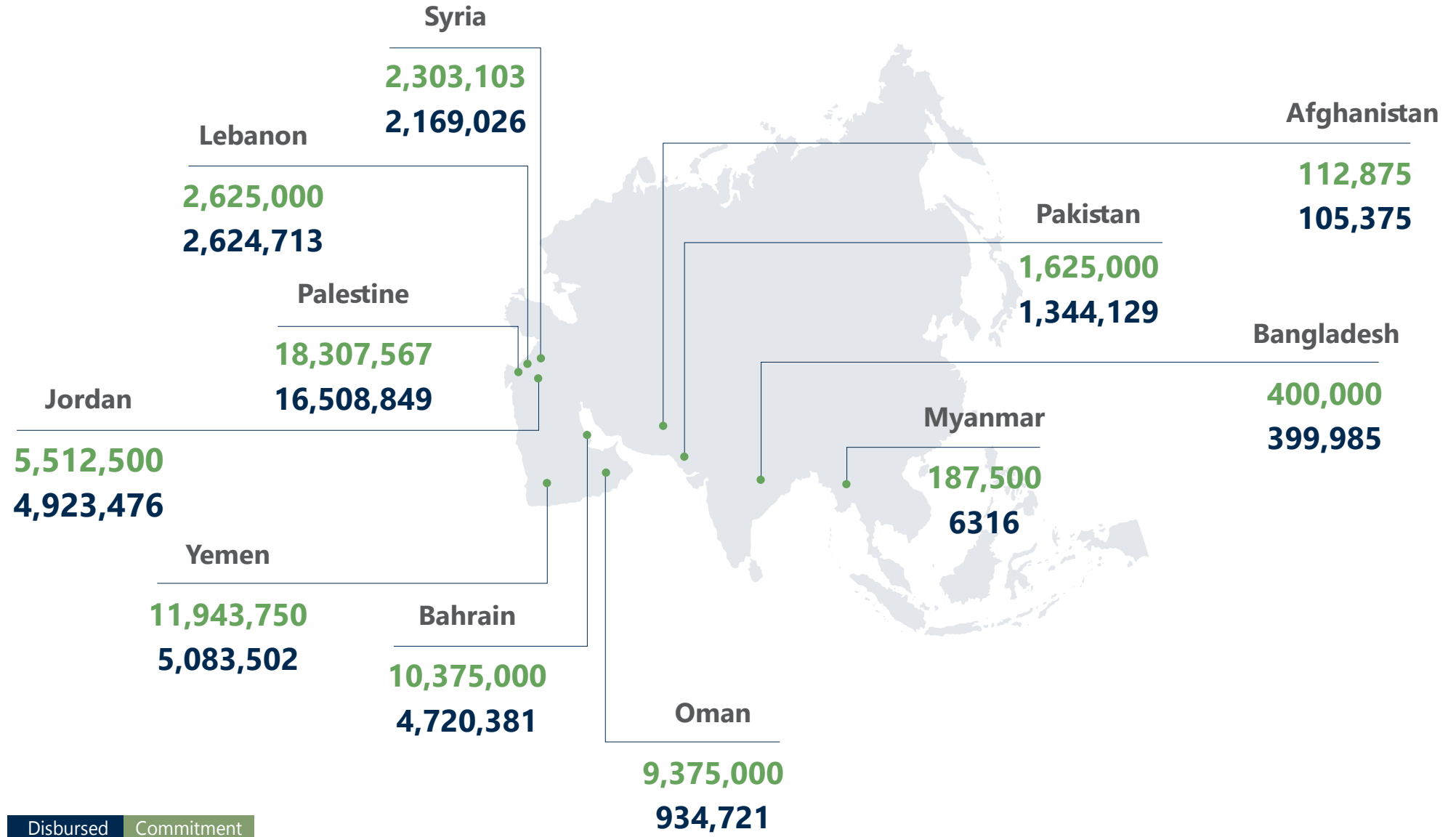

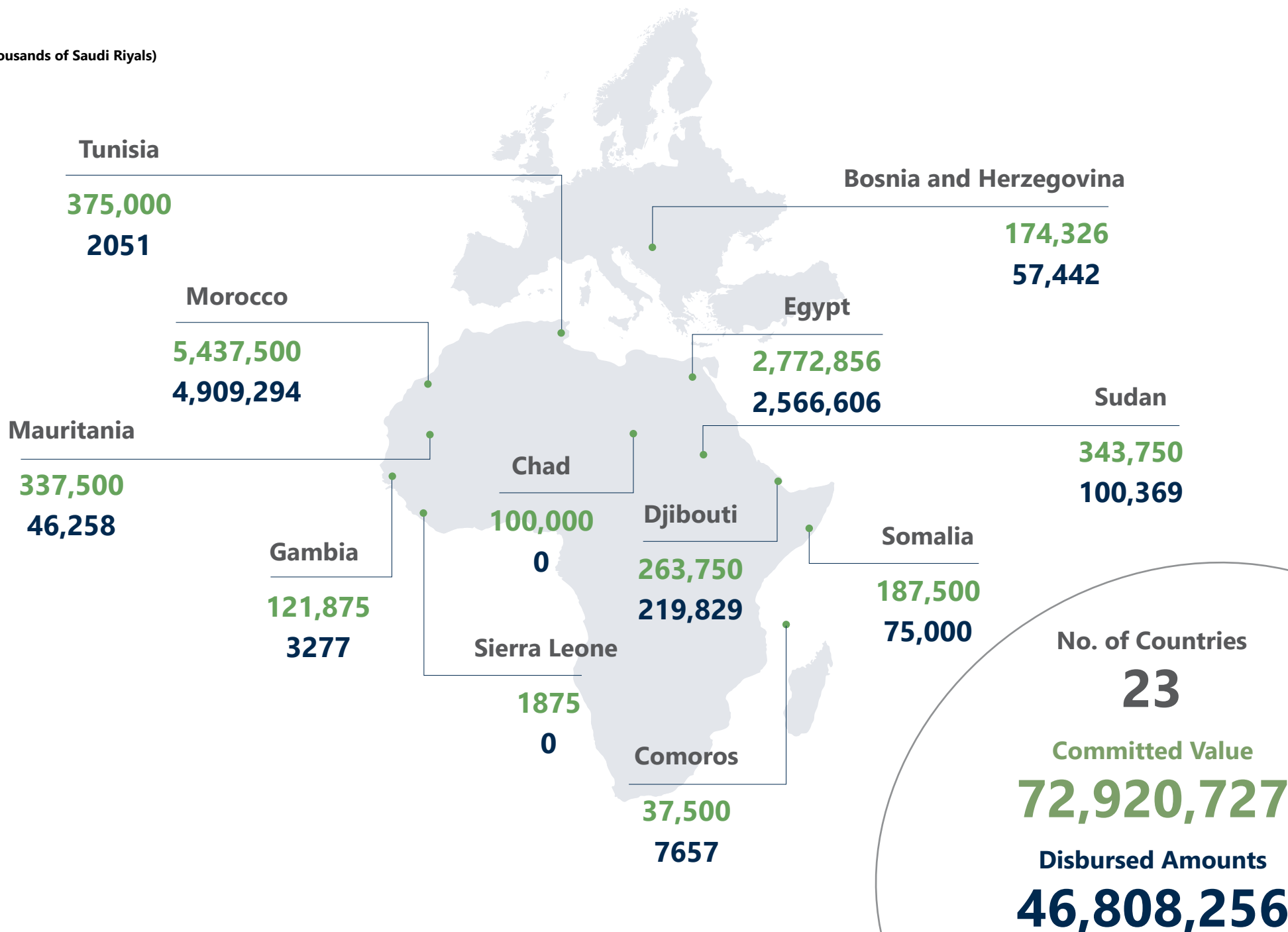

## SFD Efforts in Supporting the Agriculture Sector and Providing Food Security

The agriculture sector is a major component of economies of developing countries and plays an important role in achieving sustainability and food security. Not only does agriculture help secure livelihoods, but it can also eradicate hunger, reduce poverty, raise incomes, and improve food security for many families living in rural areas and working mainly in agriculture. In light of population growth in developing countries and issues related to climate change such as droughts, floods, the spread of agricultural pests, and misuse of modern technologies, there is an urgent need for more efforts to enhance agricultural production, provide sustainable food security, improve the global supply chain, and ensure that all people suffering from hunger and malnutrition have access to adequate food.

SDG 2 “zero hunger,” emphasizes the importance of providing food security, improving nutrition, and promoting sustainable agriculture in order to end all forms of hunger and malnutrition by 2030 and ensure that all groups, especially children, have access to adequate and nutritious food throughout the year. This effort involves promoting sustainable agricultural practices, that include supporting the agricultural sector and achieving equal access to land, technology, and markets. It requires international cooperation to ensure investment in agricultural infrastructure and technology to improve agricultural productivity, end poverty and hunger, ensure healthy lifestyles, and address climate change and other issues that are being addressed within the set of 17 SDGs in the post-2015 development agenda.

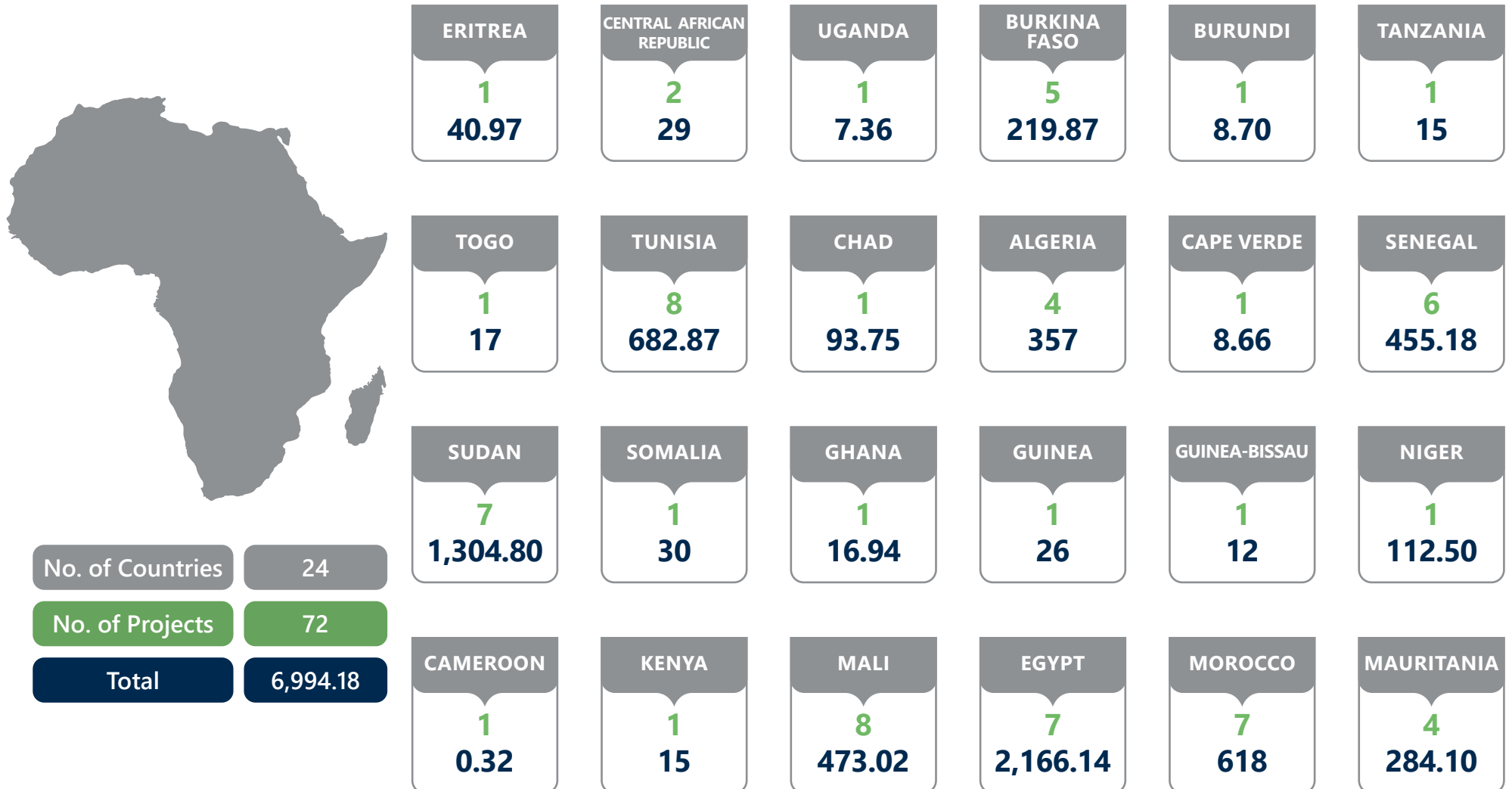
Arable land, soil, water, and the utilization of improved fertilizer are major inputs into food production, and their increasing scarcity in many parts of the world, particularly in developing countries, makes it necessary to use and manage them sustainably. Increasing yields on existing agricultural land, including reclamation of degraded land, through sustainable agricultural practices relieves pressure on agricultural land for agricultural production. Prudent management of scarce water through improved irrigation and storage technologies, together with the development of new varieties of drought - resistant crops, contribute to the sustainability of agricultural land productivity, which is crucial to avoiding significant shortages in future food production and ensuring food security and good nutrition for all.

Since the establishment of SFD, it has prioritized the agricultural sector and provided food security for developing countries. For this purpose, SFD has worked since the beginning of its lending activity until the end of 2022 to finance 97 agricultural projects with a total of SR 9,393.79 million. SFD’s support of the agricultural sector and provision of food security includes financing agricultural land reclamation projects, irrigation canals, dams, crop production, silos, grain stores, greening, and fish production.

# 1. SFD Efforts in Supporting the Agriculture Sector and Providing Food Security in Africa

In view of the urgent need of African countries to support and develop the agricultural sector, provide food security, and achieve self-sufficiency, SFD has realized since the beginning of its lending activity the importance of supporting agriculture sector projects in African countries. SFD financed 72 agricultural projects benefiting 24 countries with a total of SR 6,994.18 million. This is to finance agricultural projects in land reclamation, irrigation canals, dams, crop production, grain storage, and fisheries.

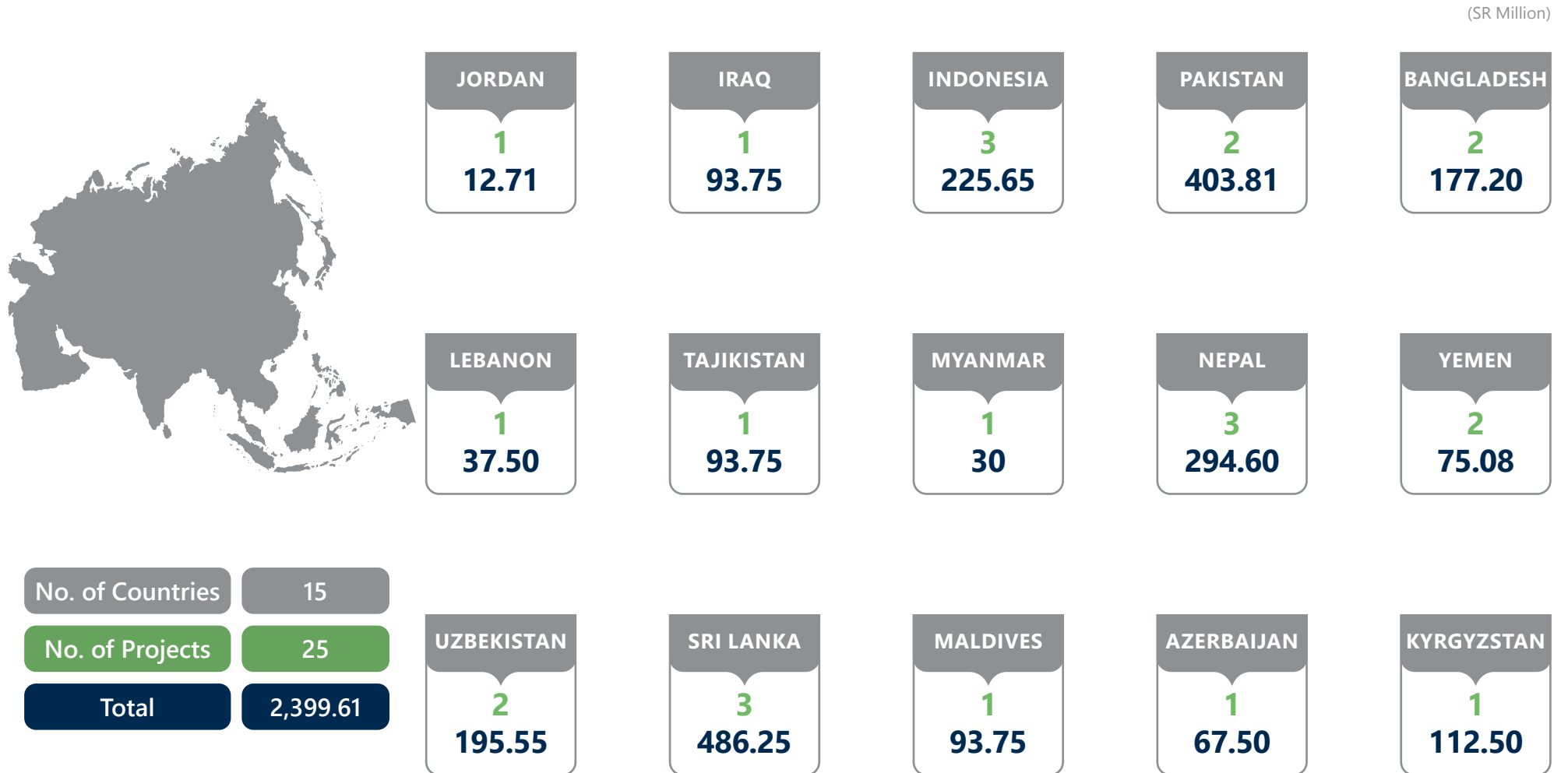

In the fiscal year 2022, the Saudi private sector benefited from the implementation of some projects that SFD contributed to financing, as the number of Saudi contracts reached 8 contracts, representing 19% of the total contracts, with an amount of SR 266.86 million, representing 43% of the total contract amounts by reservation. ## Future plans:

The sector aims to enable local content in the projects financed by SFD, and raise the content percentage to 60% by 2025 of the total projects financed by SFD. To achieve this, the sector is working on the following:

# 1

Communicate with the relevant authorities to identify the target companies, as well as governmental and semi-governmental authorities.

# 2

Create an e-registration platform for Saudi companies, supported by a proprietary classifiable database.

# 3

Formulate continuous communication procedures with companies to apply and compete by winning the implementation of projects and mechanisms to support equal opportunities.

# 4

Identifying the most important sectors in the Saudi market that can achieve a high level of contribution to the implementation of projects financed by SFD.

# 5

Designing the registration form for Saudi companies, working on building a database of Saudi companies, and developing mechanisms for communication with the private sector and government entities.

# 6

Arrange visits for delegations and figures from outside the Kingdom to Saudi companies' headquarters and factories and familiarize them with the capabilities and quality of products available at local companies.

# 7

Communicate and discuss with officials in the beneficiary countries in order to provide appropriate solutions for Saudi companies that face obstacles or challenges during the implementation of projects work.

# 8

Work to register the lessons learned from the experiences of Saudi companies in the beneficiary countries and circulate them to companies wanting to work in those countries in order to exploit the available opportunities and avoid potential risk.

# 9

Work on designing a study of the needs of countries in new projects, calculating the percentage of private sector contribution, and monitoring data periodically.

# 10

Continuous follow-up of the work accomplished by Saudi companies in the beneficiary countries and close cooperation with these companies, setting up a mechanism to monitor and evaluate the performance of Saudi companies.

# 11

Work on holding annual workshops and conferences that bring together representatives of SFD and its partners from the public and private sectors to discuss the difficulties encountered during the implementation of the SFD projects in the beneficiary countries and work to solve them.

# 12

Work with the relevant entities to encounter the challenges and obstacles encountered by the Saudi private sector abroad.

# 13

Announcing tenders for projects financed by SFD on the official website, in addition to sharing them with the relevant government authorities to present them on their official platforms, to provide the largest possible participation of Saudi companies in the competition for the implementation of these projects.

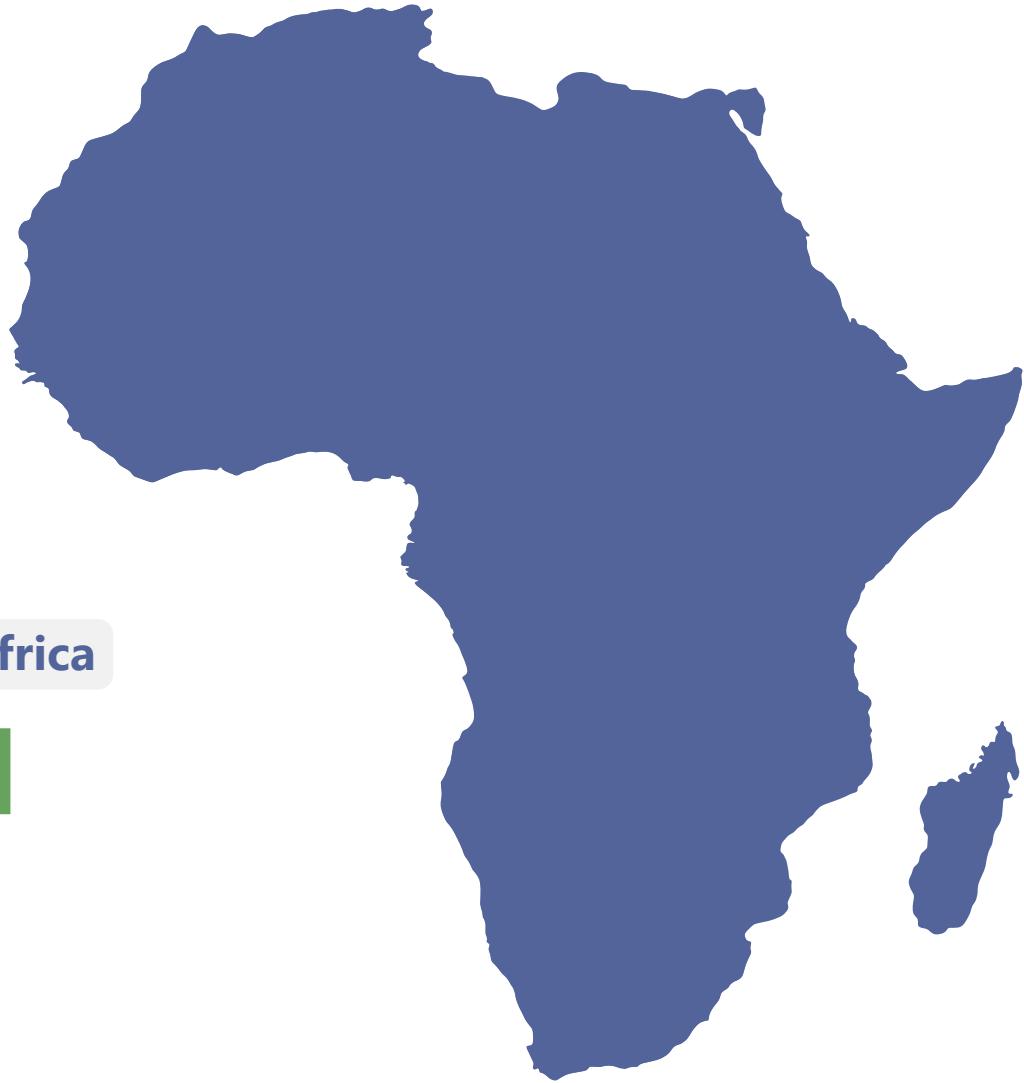
